Mirpur by-election results

Awami League to seek legal action

Awami League Friday accused the government of violating the Constitution and said it would seek legal action against the government's alleged intervention in the . Mirpur by-election results.

Speaking at a press conference at The Jatiya Press Club the AL leaders demanded reelection at 18 polling centres.

"We have already sought legal action against the violation of the Constitution and as part of it have tendered written complaints to the Returning Officer," said KM Jahangir, Chief Election Agent of the Awami League candidate.

Barrister KS Nabi has already been appointed legal counsel to start the process, he said.

The AL leaders putting forward an 11-point allegation further said that some 'dishonest' officials in collusion

with DMP Commissioner Mirza Raqibul Huda manipulated Wednesday's by-election results at some polling centres

Awami League, chief coordinator in the Mirpur by-election Begum Matia Chowdhury and nominee Kamal Ahmed Majumder were present at the press conference.

Jahangir accused that the government had violated the Articles 118 (4), 119 (1) and 126 of the Constitution.

The articles gave the Election Commission complete freedom to hold the election saying that the executive authorities would cooperate with the Commission in carrying out its responsibilities.

Awami League leaders also alleged the ruling party of violating the PRO 1972 and the Election Code of Conduct. Awami League leaders said

that the BNP ministers Goyeshwar Roy, Sadek Hossain Khoka, Major Mannan and Maya Mirza Abbas had tried to influence the election officials and the voters, despite earlier requests from the Election Commission not to move around in the constituency on the election day.

Jahangir said the EC empowered with Article 26 of the Constitution had requested the ministers not to be present at Mirpur during the time of voting on February 3 in the interest "fair and neutral election"

Jahangir said the EC also asked the DMP Commissioner not to got to Mirpur on the election day in the 'interest of fair and neutral polls' and entrusted the Additional Police Commissioner with the responsibility to maintain law and order there.

Shantibahini truce violations hamper peace process From Nurul Alam

CHITTAGONG, Feb 5: The Shantibahinimen continue to violate the truce they untlaterally declared last year jeopardising the prospects for a negotiated settlement of the Chittagong Hill Tracts' trou-

At least 30 incidents violation of ceasefire have taken place in the Hill Tracts in the last three months, security sources said.

Yesterday, the Shantibahinimen kidnapped four workers from a brickfield at Kaptai.

On Jarfuary 16 last, they also ambushed an Army patrol at Rangamati in which one soldier was critically injured. A similar incident occurred on January 13 at Bandarban.

Meanwhile, the insurgents have also geared up their drive for toll collection. The Shantibahinimen kidnapped about 50 tribals and non-tribals during the last three months.

They were, however, released after payment of ransom. Security sources say the tribal rebels appear to have been using their ceasefire period to regain their economic strength as well as to mend internal problems. They are visiting houses in plain clothes with arms and collect-

ing tolls. Sources said the amount collected through tolls in the last three months could be around Taka six crore.

The Shantibahinimen were earlier in severe economic hardship and their toll collection fell far below Taka one crore following a ban by the government on the extraction of bamboo and wood from hill districts in 1989, officials said.

Before the ban, the insurgents used to extract toll from bamboo and timber merchants. The ban was lifted on December 24, last year.

US to study fairness of Bosnian peace plan

WASHINGTON, Feb 5: President Bill Clinton said on Thursday an international peace plan for Bosnia was important but he stopped short of endorsing it, saying the United States still was reviewing its options on the civil war there, reports Reuter.

The White House said the President would support the peace plan if all the parties to the civil war there accepted it. The Bosnian Muslims are

opposed. "I think anything, any effort that increases the chance of some ultimately peaceful solution is important," Clinton told

reporters. "But I think the United States has under review now all of its options in that area. And I think at this time the position the Secretary of State has taken is the one that we have agreed on and the one l think is proper," Clinton said.

Secretary of State Warren Christopher told reporters he was taking some time to study the "fairness and feasibility" of the peace plan, which was worked out by Lord Owen, a former British Foreign Secretary, and former US Secretary of State Cyrus Vance. The plan would divide

Bosnia and Herzegovina into 10 semi-autonomous provinces - three mostly Serb, two mostly Croat, three mostly

COX'S BAZAR, Feb 5: A total of 1,142 Rohingya refugees of 245 families returned home today (Friday) under the supervision of UNHCR, reports

Official sources said the 23rd batch of the Myanmar refugees from Nayapara transit camp in Teknal thana left for their home in Arakan province voluntarily in the presence of UNHCR officials on the bank of the bordering Naaf river.

With this, the total of refugees repatriated stood at 19,831 out of some 2.65 lakh sheltered in Cox's Bazar and Bandarban districts. Additional Refugee Relief

and Repatriation Commissioner AFM Solaiman Ahsan was also present during the repatriation from 7.30 am to 10 am.

The next batch of the refugees is expected to go home on Sunday (February 7).
