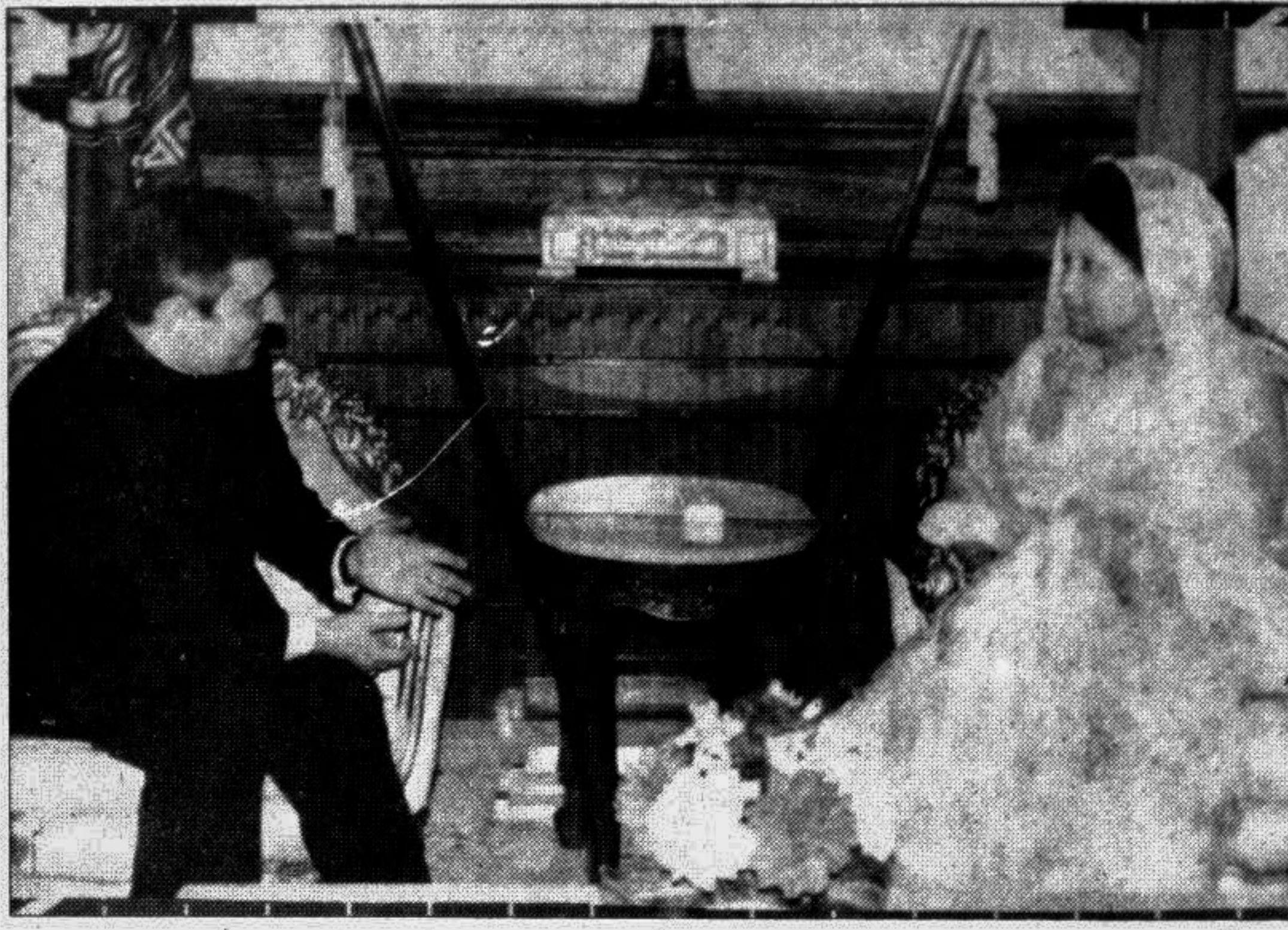
New Vatican envoy calls on Khaleda

DU to confer DSc on Prof Salam Feb 15

Dhaka University authorities will confer Doctor of Science (DSc) degree on Prof Abdus Salam, the Nobel laureate Pakistani physicist, for his outstanding contribution in science, reports UNB.

This was disclosed yesterday by Vice-Chancellor Prof Emazuddin Ahmed at a meeting with DUJA.

The honorary degree will be awarded to the Nobel laureate in a special convocation on February 15 at Curzon Hall of the university, where he will be present. Prof Salam earlier visited Bangladesh in 1981.

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia will be the chief guest at the convocation.

Prof Salam who has been playing a key role in the development of science and technology in the third world countries including Bangladesh will be the second man to receive the honorary degree.

Session jam surfaces again in JN varsity

Session jam crisis has resurfaced in the Jahangirnagar University (JU) due to a series of violent incidents disrupting the scheduled academic curricula. As a result, JU students are now one academic year behind the schedule.

In recent years, session jam which surfaced earlier was removed from the varsity through the tripartite effort of the teachers, students and administration. Trimming of the annual holidays, holding of classes in increased numbers and examinations in due time made it possible for the

session jam.

All the examinations including the masters' were postponed following a total siege laid by the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) activists in protest of expulsion of two of its members from the university for one year.

According to varsity regulations 21 days' prior notice is required for taking examinations.

The cancelled Honours courses now require over four years for completion instead of the scheduled three years. JU sources said.

They added that the Masters courses scheduled for June next cannot be held before August under present circumstances.

Teachers and students are blaming each other for this created plight. A JU teacher told The Daily Star that this has been deliberately done by the political activists to ensure the voting rights of the Masters students in the forthcoming JUCSU polls.

The teacher asked not to be named.

Election to the Jahangirnagar University Students Union (JUCSU) is scheduled for June next.

The students, on the other hand, alleged that the session jam has arisen due to the teachers' politics.

Because of the postponement of Masters examinations, admission in the first year Honours classes is also likely to be delayed.

Delayed admission will once again initiate the process of a lengthy academic session resulting in wastage of time of the students and government revenues, guardians said.
