Former President Ershad, his wife Raushan Ershad and 18 others are accused in this case. Raushan Ershad, however, was not present in the court yesterday. Additional Session Judge and Special Judge Ansaruddin Sikder was the presiding judge.

When the defence lawyer asked the witness whether he was present when Ershad went to Kawran Bazar to enquire about the development of Ambar Shah Mosque and also met local people including persons affected due to land acquisition, he replied in the

However, unlike in the past the UNHCR officials have now independent access to the would-be returnees to determine if they are heading home voluntarily.
