

fire during the Olympic Games - a return to the practice of ancient Greece - has been handed to the United Nations by the Olympic movement's head Juan Antonio Samaranch.

He revealed the plan at a press conference during the world beach volleyball finals here. The idea would held keep the Olympics faithful to its

tribute to peace," according to
