## Speakers at a seminar

# Solution to flood problem a must

SHERPUR, Feb 19: The severity of the flash floods caused by the rivers from the hills in the north- eastern region of the country came in for detailed discussions at a seminar here Thursday participated by the Members of Parliament, water experts and representatives of grass root level organisations, reports BSS.

All were near unanimous that flash floods cause immense damages to crops, livestock, communications and overall infrastructure in quick time and set at naught the development activities.

Hence, they said, this problem needs to be resolved in all earnestness so as the save a large area of the country from the onslaughts of the flash floods.

Organised by the Flood Plan Coordination Organisation (FPCO) and the North-East Regional Water Management Study (Flood Action Plan- 6), the seminar was participated by Members of Parliament belonging to different parties bailing from the affected and adjoining areas.

Begum Matia Chowdhury, Abul Hasan Chowdhury, Dr Serajul Huq, Promoda Mankin

Chief Engineer of the region Abdus Salam, the Superintending Engineer of the FPCO M Shafi, and several persons from the area gave their opinion on the flood action plans echoing the opinion of local people on the issues involving flood control and wa-

ter management.

The seminar formed a part of the series of such seminars being held in different parts of the country involving the peoples representatives in formulating plans under the broader "flood action plans."

The participants touched upon specific problems and the way for their solution taking into account the distinct characteristics of a region or area while tackling the problems of flood and water management.

At times they gave varying opinion how best a problem in a particular locality could be solved but all agreed that the new and pro-people approach was something not only praiseworthy but will also be meaningful.

"This is the positive fruit of democracy" Begum Matia Chowdhury said adding that previously local problems were without any grass root level contacts and consequently, many projects proved infractu-

ous and eventually floundered. Begum Chowdhury particularly pointed out to the flash floods and said the consequences of this kind of flooding were more damaging than the normal floods.

The sands coming with the hfils along with the flash floods cause additional problems, she said and urged the experts to look into the concept of "sandam" that has been adopted in Japan to solve the problem of sand.

Begum Matia Chowdhury referred to other problems including scarcity of waters during the lean season and called for effective schemes.

Dr Serajul Huq stressed that care should be taken so that an area was not affected due to the reactions of a scheme or project in another area. "This should not be hit for a solution of a water problem in that area," he said, and called for formulating coordinated plans.

Dr Huq deplored that scant attention was given by the Water development Board to this region earlier but said taken up for their solution whole approach that has been

adopted now was really note-

worthy. Abul Hasan Chowdbury said such seminars were laudable since they helped establish contacts at ground levels but cautioned that studies should not be left in cold storage since the experiences about seminars in this country were

not one of happy one. Mirza Azam said river erosion posed a serious problem and this had already devoured one fourth of his constituency threatening the thana headquarters.

Pramode Mankin said woes caused to the people by flash floods needed paramount consideration since the effects of

this problem knew no bounds. Chief Engineer of the Water Development Board Abdus Salam said the results of current exercise of different components of the flood actions plan could be felt in the near future. The studies are not left in files, he said adding that many of the studies had been put into implementation by this time.

### Prices of LP gas up

SIRAJGANJ, Feb 19: Prices of Liquified Petrol (LP) gas have risen due to shortage of supply in the 16 northern districts, consumers informed, reports UNB.

They said a section of unscrupulous gas traders increased the prices of liquified

Shortage of gas supply in the area and frequent transport strikes are the main reasons for the sharp increase of the price level of LP gas in the local markets, consumers said.

The gas in cylinders were brought at Baghabari Ghat through water ways and later carried by lorries to different districts in the northern re-

But emergence of innumerable chars and shoals at the river Jamuna hampers smooth transportation of gas cylinders which further increased the cost and hamper smooth supply in the interior. The traders were charging

Taka 210 to 275 per cylinder of gas instead of its retail price of Taka 202.

The demand for LP gas also rose among the consumers in the backdrop of price hike of fire wood and kerosene and restriction on using electric heater.

#### India plans to mop up idle gold holdings NEW DELHI, Feb 19: India,

which liberalised gold imports last year, announced Thursday an attractive scheme to mop up the idle gold holdings of its citizens, according to AFP.

The government said a fiveyear gold bond scheme would open for subscription on March 15 and carry an interest of 40 rupee (1.33 dollar) per gram (0.03 ounce) for a minimum of 500 grams (17.8 ounces) of gold pledged.

The bonds would be repaid in gold on maturity, a statement by the finance ministry

The announcement said subscribers would not be asked about the source of their yellow metal and the transferable bonds, available from select state-run banks until June 14, would not attract income or gift tax.

There would be no ceiling on the quota of quantity of gold pledged under the scheme. The ministry said the bond can be used to secure advances from banks, while initial subscribers would also get special tax benefita

#### IMF to lend Pakistan \$ 1b more

ISLAMABAD. Feb 19: The International Monetary Fund said it had agreed in Principle to lend 1.0 billion dollar more to Pakistan under its extended Structural Adjustment Facility Programme, reports Reuter.

The IMF Middle East Department Director Paul Chabrier said the loan would be provided at an interest rate of 0.5 per cent because Pakistan falls into the category of low-income countries.

Final discussions regarding the loan package are to be held later, with the amount to be released in three instalments over the next 10 years, Chabrier told local reporters.
