ICM submits memorandum to Indian High Commission

Police stopped several thousand activists of Islami Constitution Movement (ICM—Islami Shashantara Andolon) marching towards the Indian High Commission Saturday to demand reconstruction of Babri Mosque on its original site.

A special division of riot police barricaded the marchers near the Science Laboratory gate and allowed four of their representatives to hand over a memorandum to the High Commission.

The activists, led by Pir Saheb of Charmoni Maulana Syed Fazlul Karim staged a sit-in on the New Elephant Road until the representatives came back after handing over the memo at around 1:00 pm.

They were reciting religious verses and chanting slogan "India will break into pieces as consequence of mosque demolition."

In the memo addressed to Indian Prime Minister Narasimha Rao they placed a five-point demand including ban on worship at the makeshift temple on Babri Mosque site, protection of minority Muslim in India and compensation for the victims of communal violence. It also urged Indian authorities to resolve bilateral disputes like Taipatti, Farakkan through dialogue.

One security official received that memo as the High Commission was closed on Saturday, the weekly holiday.

Earlier, before starting the march from near the Battul Mukarram Mosque, Maulana Fazlul Karim told his supporters that "everything happened in India with the help of Rao government."

BCAA projects reviewed

The 12th meeting of the standing committee on the Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism was held yesterday at the Sangsad Bhaban with State Minister for Civil Aviation and Tourism Abdul Mannan in the chair, reports BSS.

The meeting reviewed the various ongoing projects of the Bangladesh Civil Aviation Authority (BCAA) and gave some important suggestions for the overall development.
