25 thousand leprosy patients cured since '85

Some 25,000 leprosy patients, abandoned by their families and the society, have Chandraghona, a hamlet in the hill district, reports UNB.

They have been treated and operated upon for the slow to show, hard to eradicate and deformity creating disease at the Chandraghona Leprosy Centre (CLC) since April

About 6 lakh people have been suffering from this deadly disease in the country and some 1.5 crore in the world According to WHO, Asia has the largest share with about 62 per cent followed by Africa with 34 per cent.

CLC was set up in 1913 as a unit of Chandraghona Christian Mission Hospital established in 1908 by Baptist Missionery Society at Chandraghona, 50 kilometres from the port city of Chittagong. It was mod ernised and turned into a fullfledged leprosy hospital in 1985. Lokman Ali (45) of

Gaibandha has recovered after six years of treatment at the leprosy hospital. "I was brought here one day after Bangabandhu was assassinated and I was released from the hospital a week after President Zia was killed. "I was not accepted by my

family as I became untouchable suffering from the disease," says Lokman, a shoe-maker for leprosy patients in CLC. He had returned to the hospital, got a job and married another patient. She has also recovered. "We are now happy with two normal kids."

Jainul Abedin (31) of Feni,

ease in Kuwait while serving there, is under treatment in got back their normal life at a CLC since 1989. He is improvleprosy hospital at ing fast as the disease was de tected at an early stage, said an attending physician.

Rant Chakma (20) of Adrakchhora in Khagrachhari, who was abandoned by her husband due to the disease, and many other like her were happy to get "a new life" after treatment at the hospital.

Leprosy is a chronic infectious disease caused by a bacteria called Mycrobacterium leprae mainly affecting the skin and the periphery

Doctors at the hospital told UNB that although leprosy is a disabling disease, with early diagnosis and proper treatment it is possible to cure without any damaging after af-

But, they suggested that the patients should be educated in the correct use and care of hands, feet, so that serious damage to the part and troublesome complications and deformities can be prevented. This activity should be considered as a part of treatment. "It is diagnosable, treatable

and curable," says Dr. Kentaro Hatane, a Japaneso donter who has been associated with the leprosy hospital sinee 1985 Leprosy can be effectively treated, he asserted adding that once a patient is on adequate therapy, he rapidly becomes non-infectious. The Chandraghona Leprosy

Centre has 13 clinics in Chittagong and Chittagong Hill Tracts region, providing preliminary and outdoor treat ment to the patients. A total of

1,307 patients were given outdoor treatment in December hist year alone.

At present the centre has more than 2,500 leprosy patients under its treatment. On an average, it operates upon 300 patients a year and provides them with free accommodation, medicine, diet, linen footware and cratches.

It usually takes 6 months to 2 years time for complete recovery from leprosy. But some patients took 4-7 years to fully recover from the disease. To fight with leprosy, there

are 10 hospitals in the country - three run by the government and seven by non-government organisations.

Housed on the foot of a hill beside the main road in the locality, the CLC has a hill top area of about 100 acres where small houses have been built for rehabilitation of the patients. They are engaged in horticulture and some other income generating activities to earn their livelihood.

Swe Sau Marma, a recep tionist at the CLC, was a patient of leprosy for eight years. He is now rehabilitate at the centre as his family declined to accept him after recovery.

As most of the patients are poor and illiterate, the hospital authorities are imparting informal education to them with special emphasis on health ed-Leprosy has been claiming

human beings since 600 BC in the globe. The countries in Asia, where leprosy is epidemic, are India, Burma, Laos and Vietnam. This high endemic area makes the belt from the south India to the end of south-east Asia.
