

Meanwhile, the Fisheries Department has set up two more fish farms and four mini-hatcheries in Chapainawabganj and Natore districts under the Coordinated Pisciculture Project.

90 MW power station

PDB, Japanese firm sign contract worth Tk 290cr

A turn-key contract to the tune of about Tk 290 crore between Bangladesh Power Development Board (PDB) and M/s. Sumitomo Corporation of Japan for the construction of a 90 MW combined cycle power station at Fenchuganj in Sylhet was signed in the city Saturday at WAPDA building, reports BSS.

The total cost of the project is Taka 404 crore of which the OECF of Japan will provide the foreign exchange component of Taka 290 crore, according to a PDB press release.

The 90 MW combined cycle power station project comprising two gas turbine units and one steam turbine unit of 30 MW capacity each will come into operation by October

Supply of essential equipment, materials for the three units and construction of a 11/132 KV substation are included among other works under the project.

On completion of the project additional 50 MW of electricity will be transmitted to the national grid line after meeting the 40 MW demand of electricity in the districts of greater Sylhet.

Secretary of PDB Md Azharul Islam and Deputy General Manager of Ship and Plant Division of M/s. Sumitomo Corporation Tadao Yuasa signed the turn-key contract on behalf of their respective organisations.

Agroforestry training workshop

Kenya decontrols grain prices

NAIROBI, Feb 27: The Kenyan government has decontrolled prices of maize and wheat and other grains, giving farmers the right to set the price of their products according to market forces, the Agriculture Ministry announced yesterday, reports

Grain prices were previ ously set by the government owned national cereals board, which acted as a middleman between producers and consumers buying farm produce from farmers and marketing it.

Current producer price for a 90 kilogramme bag of maize, Kenya's staple food, is 600 shilling (16 dollar) and that of wheat 660 shilling (18 dollar).

The government has also raised producer prices for sugarcane, rice, cashew nut and cotton.

Meanwhile, the Finance Ministry has announced that importers will start receiving their foreign exchange allocation from commercial banks instead of the central bank.
