'JPL incorporated with RJSC before purchasing land'

The Special Judge's Court trying former President H M Ershad, his wife Begum Raushan Ershad and 18 others in the Janata Tower Case' yesterday recorded the deposition of four prosecution witnesses raising the number of PWs cross examined so far to 14, report BSS.

The depositions and cross examinations of two of them were recorded by Additional Sessions Judge and Special Judge Md Ansaruddin Sikder. Yesterday's witnesses - all employees of the office of the Registrar of Joint Stock Company (RJSC) were not earlier named in the chargesheet of this Special Case 11 of

It was revealed in the court yesterday that Raushan Ara Begum alias Begum Raushan Ershad, Chairman of Janata Publishers Limited (JPL) had the company JPL incorporated with RJSC having shown 49 Kawran Bazar Commercial Area (KCA) as its registered office before the company actually purchased the land.

Syed Md Mohsin, Inspector of RJSC and PW-12 during deposition yesterday informed the court that his office received an application from JPL on 19.10.1989 showing 49 KCA as its registered office. He further said Mrs Raushan Ara Begum as Chairman of JPL later submitted all relevant papers required within the framework of company law. Her prayer was granted and JPL was incorporated as a private company on 25.10.1989, Mohsin said.

The proposed law said that any quarter trying to usurp state power by unconstitutional means should be condemned guilty of high treason' and also sought 'effective measures to check and eliminate all sorts of communalism is awaiting the presidential permission to be placed in the House for discussion.

On the fate of his bill, Rashed Khan Menon told The Daily Star yesterday that the delay reflected the ruling party's lack of 'political will' to fulfil its commitment.

Salauddin Yusuf moved his bill July 18 last year seeking amendment to 5 Articles of the Constitution. An elevenmember Special Parliamentary Committee headed by the Law and Justice Minister Mirza Golam Hafiz was formed to scrutinise the bill a week later.

The bill specifically sought that 'the control (including the power of posting, promotion and grant of leave) and discipline of persons employed in the judicial service and magistrates exercising judicial functions' be 'vest with the Supre-

Presently, 'appointments of persons to offices in the judicial service or as magistrates exercising judicial functions are made by the President in accordance with rules made by him in that behalf."

According to a proposed amendment to this Article, the appointments would be made by he President 'on the recommendation of the Supreme

Court of the country'. The special committee on the proposed law had met six times since its inception 17 months ago but was yet to

reach a consensus. Salauddin Yusuf, mover of the bill, while giving his reaction over the delay, told The Daily Star last night that the dilly-dallying would not help consolidate parliamentary democracy.

The draft of the parliament secretariat bill was finalised by the nine-member Parliamentary Standing Committee on Privileges of Parliament Members headed by the Speaker January 30, 1992.

Parliament was in favour of the law following a lengthy discussion on the issue in the House October 13, 1991.

According to the schedule of the proposed law, the secretariat comprising a total of 76 posts would be accommodating more than 100 staff members 75-member committee were including one chief secretary, one additional secretary, one joint secretary and one deputy

secretary. If passed the law would make provisions for the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Deputy Leader of the House, the Leader of the Opposition, the Deputy Leader of the Opposition, the Chief Whip of

COX'S BAZAR, Feb 27: Some eighty Rohingya refugees today voluntarily went back to their homes in Myanmar through three transit camps at Teknaf here today, official sources said, reports BSS.

This was the 30th batch of Rohingyas to be repatriated

The total number of repatriated persons now stands at 21,725. The UNHCR representatives and Bangladesh officials saw the refugees off at Noyapara-2, Jummapara and Rongikhali transit camps at the time of their repatriation.

About 13,000 refugees are now awaiting repatriation at the three transit camps, the sources said.
