# Problems hamper education of 65,000 school students

SATKHIRA, Mar 1: One hundred sixty seven recognised non-government secondary schools in all the seven thanas of the district are beset with manifold problems hampering education of about

65,000 students. According to sources, dilapidated condition of school buildings, shortage of furniture, accommodation, science building, play ground, common room and fund are hindering smooth education in these schools.

Many school houses are in pitiable condition. Some schools are holding classes in decaying buildings which may collapse any moment.

During the rainy season water leaks through the roof of the buildings. Besides, only 10 percent schools have one or two storied buildings while others are housed in semipucca tinsheds. These schools are facing

the increasing number of students. About 70 percent of these schools have neither buildings no necessary science equipment. Absence of playground in 40

## Bus journey hazardous on Kishoreganj-Bhairab road



KISHOREGANJ, Mar Journey by bus on the Kishoreganj-Bhairab road has become hazardous and over loading of buses often leads to accident causing untold sufferings to the passengers. According to sources, the

law-enforcing agency cannot findout the drivers responsible for the accident as they use fake name and addresses without having any valid licences. In recent days many road accidents accrued on the road. Whenever a bus stops passengers get in the vehicle and they are even allowed to sit on the roof of the bus and to stand on the bumper or on the footboard. This entails a great risk. Besides buses used to carry a huge quantity of goods on the roofs. It is also found that most of the buses and mini-buses on the road are engaged in mad competition to pick up passengers without considering the capacity of the vehicles. It was also observed that driver

of the one-crowded buses have indulged themselves in overtaking other buses plying on the road at a maximum shed and are very often involved in fatal road mishap. Besides, bus conductors realise excessive fare and often misbehave with the passengers. They do not maintain any time-table to reach Bhairab from Kishoreganj though the distance is about 33 miles. It may be mentioned here that black smoke emitting

from vehicles freely on the road may cause health hazard disturbing sounds of horns of the vehicles causes much annovance to the public tranquillity. Absence of a waiting shed at Nagua bus stand here causes much inconveniences to the travellers. There is no latrines or urinals on the bus stand.
