Population control seen a must to achieve child, mother welfare

A 12-day short course on Maternal and Child Health Care (MCH) began here yesterday with an objective to evolve means for reduction of child mortality and promotion of physical and psychological development of the child, reports BSS.

Organised by Bangladesh College of General Practitioners (BCGP) in collaboration with Directorate of Health Services and World Health Organisation (WHO), the inaugural function of the course was held at the auditorium of National Institute for Preventive and Social Medicines (NIPSO).

Director General, Family Planning, AKM Rafiquzzaman attended the inaugural session as chief guest while WHO Representative in Bangladesh Dr ANA Abeyesundere and WHO Consultant Prof Myo Thwe were the special guests.

Presided over by BCGP President MA Jalil, the inaugural function was also addressed, among others, by BCGP Secretary Dr Alhaj Md Manirul Alam, BCGP Dhaka centre President Dr Md Nurul

Islam and master of the session Dr Shahida Rahman, BCGP Research Associate Dr BB Barua Presented key-note paper on the subject.

In his brief inaugural speech, AKM Rafiquzzaman called for a united thrust of all connected with health care services and family welfare activities to arrest child mortality and ensure proper medicare facilities to mother, particularly during their pregnancy period.

Referring to the tremendous success achieved by Bangladesh in the field of family welfare activities, Rafiquzzaman said it was possible because of relentless efforts and integrated thrust by the government as well as NGOs and donor agencies including WHO. In this connection he pointed out that for 1992 Bangladesh had been adjudged as one of the best five countries in the world to achieve commendable success to arrest population explosion. This will be ceremonially announced within few months in New York by concerned agencies, he added.

Rafiquzzaman said that child and mother welfare could not be achieved without making population control drive a success. For this, a more realistic, pragmatic and dynamic team-work shall have to be established, he added. He also said that coordination in this regard shall have to be made upto thana level between different government and non-government agencies concerned with family planning and health care activities.

Dr ANA Abeyesundere said that effective maternal and child health care in a developing country like Bangladesh could significantly reduce maternal and child mortality and morbidity. 'Family planning perse will not have an impact, unless maternal and child health is offered as a total package including the family planning initiatives,' he added.

As an effort towards safe motherhood initiative Dr Abeyesundere suggested, regressing the socio-economic legal and educational inequities confronting women, and ensuring that couples in all strata of life have access to family planning.

BSB okays Tk 2.8 cr for industrial project

Bangladesh Shilpa Bank (BSB) yesterday sanctioned a loan of Tk 2.80 crore including foreign exchange equivalent to Tk 2.37 crore for a new industrial project, reports BSS.

The loan was sanctioned at the 202nd meeting of the BSB's Board of Directors held at the BSB's head office here with A T M Alamgir MP and Chairman of the board in the chair.

The new project is to be set up at Katpatty, Narayanganj, with annual production capacity of 1049,040 kg knitting, 996,588 kg dyeing and 359,879 dozen of export-oriented knitted garments (T-shirt).

On implementation the project is expected to create employment opportunities for about 262 persons and likely to contribute worth about Tk 3.87 crore to the annual GDP of the country.
