According to the newly an nounced schedule the transfers will be held from March 15 to April 2 inclusive of a week-long interval for the Etd Festival instead of March 15 to things." 21 as was originally fixed.

Soon after the meeting the representatives of Abahani Chakra Krira Mohammedan Sporting Club, the two soccer giants of the country who had asked the au thorities to defer the transfers until April 20, told some newsmen that they would not participate in the player trad

Abahani and Mohammedans are likely to announce their own programmes in this con nection within a couple of

Although there was no official representative of Abahant in vesterday's meeting. Shah Alam Chowdhury, a DMFA joint secretary who is also an Abahani official, explained Abahani's view regarding the matter. Fazlur Rahman Babul, a former member of the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) - the Mohammedans representative - strongly crit icised the DMFA decision.

The representative of the Bangladesh Public Works Department was the only one to support the giants' stance while the other seventeen club representatives reportedly welcomed the league committee announcement

The meeting, presided over by committee chairman Shahidul Islam Chowdhury was informed that the DMFA would receive 20 lakh taka from the BFF as loan and evenly distribute the money among the 20 participating clubs to equip them better for the transfers.

The DMFA will return the money from gate-receipts or the fund provided by the spon-

If Abahani and Mohammedans abstain from the transfers and subsequently stay away from the Premier Division league, necessary disciplinary measures will be taken against them as per the by-laws, the DMFA secretary Kazi Mishu said after the meeting.

In that highly unlikely scenario, according to the bylaws, the top two teams of the country would be relegated to the First Division from the new Premier Division league, to be introduced from this sea-


