Sale of Indian sugar on

Tk 45 cr sugar lying unsold in Dinajpur

DINAJPUR, Mar 13: Sugar worth about Taka 45 crore has been lying unsold in the godowns of three sugar mills of the district due to rampant sales of Indian sugar in local markets, reports UNB.

About 80,000 metric tons of sugar in the godowns of Sctabganj, Thakurgaon and Panchagarh Sugar Mills is lying idle as Indian sugar has flooded the local markets, informed sources said. As a result, sugar cane

growers remain unpaid of their outstanding dues of about Taka 18 core from the mills. Besides, they are compelled

to sell their produce to third party on cash payment at a rate of Taka 25 as against the mill rate of Taka 37.50 per maund, it is learnt.

The growers urged the concerned authorities to take measures to check smuggling of Indian sugar and pay their outstanding dues immediately Our correspondent adds: Absence of transport facilities for students of Dinajpur Government Girls' High School
