In the FIR Aminul Islam said that while he along with other police men obstructed an 'unlawful' assembly of Samannaya Committee near Taher Auditorium at around 4:30 pm on Friday, a mob led by Imam and Razzak attacked the policemen with lethal and deadly weapons leaving three police constables injured and damaging helmets and shields of police.
