Housing sector deserves priority

The housing construction sector deserves a priority attention as the thrust sector. It has tremendous potential for growth, with wider linkage effects on the overall development process. The Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry (DCCI) made this observation in its Monthly Review of February, 1993.

There are several factors weighing heavily in its favour, says DCCI. A vibrant construction industry, particularly relating to housing activities, can provide a boost to economic growth, generate employment at various income levels, create demand for varieties of construction materials, fittings and fixtures, and forge beneficial links with the technologyoriented services sector, besides meeting one basic human need coming next only to food and clothing.

Housing and related construction activities can also become the most thriving operational area for growth of private sector, observes DCCI.

Earlier sizeable private sector investments in urban housing construction sector were witnessed. Since the midcighties, private developers have made investments initially on low-rise walk-up pro-

private sector investments. Rising land prices, higher construction costs and lack of time for individuals in building their own home have brought about a change in demand for apartment houses in recent times. Furthermore, an increasing number of buyers among the overseas Bangladeshi wage-earners have imported western influence and apartment lifestyle, notes

Of late there is a lull in housing construction by private developers, points out DCCI. The depressed demand factor, among other operational constraints, has compressed housing construction activities in the private sector.

As far as the problem in Dhaka city is concerned, rising land value and availability of modern technology make the choice for high buildings very obvious, emphasises DCCI. For private real estate developers, marketing and affordability are of course the most important criteria for developing their projects. The government can play here the lead role by setting realistic goals in housing, supporting it with practical policies and regulations, so that increasingly wider target groups find proper housing affordable.

DCCI notes here that land and building materials account for the lion's share of housing costs. Although most construction items are manufactured or available locally, such materials as much as the imported components thereof, are generally high priced, because of duty structure and other distortions, often induced by government policies. Land prices are also high relative to our income levels and increasing rapidly, due to a chronic shortage when compared to the demand. The situation calls for an active involvement of the state in the supply and release of land in the market for immediate development, along with a framework for long-term land development

programmes. Poor funding support are deterring developers from taking projects which would help meet the requirement of wider target groups, adds DCCI. Funding arrangements for the house buyers also do

practice of home mortgage loans in Bangladesh. Affordability of the larger target is thus very much limited.

There are several other problems, restricting also the growth of real estate development in the private sector, says DCCI. Extremely slow, cumbersome and expensive processes in buying and selling properties, foreclosure of property collateral, exorbitant transfer costs, the practice of revising zoning by the planning authorities and their inability to enforce building regulations causing uncertainty in planning projects on a long-term basis etc can be cited. Taxes are also particularly excessive to the point of being erippling for this industry.

It is thus very clear that there are several obstacles to effective private sector partieipation in housing construction or development. Only the government can remove such problems or obstacles and, thus, create an enabling environment for a successful housing market for all. This will call for a coherent and integrated policy support by various ministrics such as finance, works, land and law, all working in concert, concludes

India asks WB to pull out \$3b controversial dam project

NEW DELHI, Mar 30: India has asked the World Bank to pull out of a controversial three billion dollar dam project which threatens to submerge the ancestral lands of nearly 250,000 aboriginals,

A senior official at the Department of Economic Affairs said today the government had told the World Bank it no longer required the bank's funds for the Sardar Sarovar Project to harness the waters of the Narmada River

"We have sought the World Bank's disengagement from the project," the official said. But the project will go ahead with our own resources."

He said India had asked the World Bank to cancel the remaining 170 million dollar due on a 450 million dollar loan.
