A tragic end to China's reign



HONG KONG, Apr 4: Indonesia beat defending champions China 3-2 Sunday and won the Asian Badmi-

nton Championship after a Chinese player collapsed in a key doubles match, reports agencies.

Indonesian Haryanto Arby, recently crowned All-England champion, defeated Chinese Wu Wenkai 15-3, 15-8, but China evened the score when Chen Kang and Chen Hongyong beat Ricky Subagia and Rexy Mainaky 15-12, 18-13 in dou-Indonesian regained the

lead when Alan Budi Kusuma beat Liu Jun 15-6, 17-18, 15-4 in the second singles. In the remaining doubles

match, Chinese Zheng Yumin collapsed when he and partner Huang Zhangzhong were leading 2-0 in the first set against Imay Hendra and Hermawan Susanto.

Zheng was taken to a hospital, where his condition was described as fair.

The doubles match was awarded to the Indonesians, giving them an unbeatable 3-1 lead. Indonesian Ardy Wiranata then defaulted the final singles match to Wang Zhengwen. Earlier, Indonesia, who de-

feated Malaysia 3-2 in the semi-finals, did not miss a step despite the absence of Olympic gold medalist Allan Budi Kusuma, Saturday.

China booked their berth with a comprehensive 4-1 victory over Taiwan, the tournament's surprise card, in the other semi-final.

Oozing confidence, the Indonesians preferred to rest Kusuma, who is carrying a niggling injury, and replaced him with Hermawan Susanto, in

Out of the blues

HONG KONG, Apr 4: Chinese doubles specialist Zheng Yumin suffered a heart attack and collapsed on court during the finals against Indonesia at the Sciko Asian **Badminton** Championships he-re Sunday, reports AFP.

The 25-year-old Zheng was given mouth to mouth resuscitation and a cardiac massage by medical personnel before being rushed to hospital.

"He had no pulse but after he was given an electric shock treatment, his pulse started beating again," said punch Gunalan, secretary general of the Asian Badminton Con-federation.

"He has recovered eonsciousness, but we don't know exactly what his latest condition is," added Gunalan. China were trailing Indonesia 1-2, having lost both the first two singles, when the tragedy struck.


