CHAPAINAWABGANJ, Apr 13: Three people were awarded death sentence by the District and Sessions Judge Court here today (Tuesday) for killing nine members of their family in 1991, reports UNB.

The convicts are Mattur Rahman (37), Ataur Rahman (35) and Nazrul Islam (30) of Dadpur village in Gomostapur thana of the district. Ten others were acquitted of the murder charge.

According to the case, the convicts in connivance with other forcibly entered the house of their father Abdus Sattar Biswas (69) and chopped him and their step mother Salma Khatun (40) to death on the night of June 14,

They also killed their sister Johra Khatun (19) and her two and a half year old child, step sister Rozia (9), and step brothers Rezaul (7), Jabbar (5), Motakabber (3) and Saddam (1) with sharp weapons while they were asleep.

Police suspected family feud was the cause of the brutal killings and arrested the three sons of Biswas and 10 other

people in this connection. According to their confessional statement, they recovered the bodies, packed in five gunny bags, from Bholahat border area.

A case was filed with the local thana and police submitted the chargesheet against 13 people after investigation.

District and Sessions Judge Abdul Kadir Khan found the three sons of Biswas guilty and awarded them death sentence after examining witnesses and records of the case.

PP Advocate Strajul Islam appeared on behalf of the state while Advocate Golam Kabir, Advocate Taher Jamil and Advocate Sultanul Islam Moni defended the accused.

ISLAMABAD, Apr 13: A judicial commission set up by Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif is to begin an immediate investigation into the death of former Pakistan Army Chief Asif Nawaz whose wife claims he was poisoned, it was announced today, reports AFP.

NEW DELHI, Apr 13 : Bombay found 25 rockets today in the latest weapons seizure since the March 12 bomb blasts which killed nearly 300 people in the Western Indian city, the Press Trust of India (PTI) said, reports AFP.

The rockets were lifted from the seabed in Raigad District of Maharashtra state. which police say served as the landing point for the explosives smuggled in to carry out the bombings, the agency Police suspect that the

rockets were to be used to attack the residence of Hindu fundamentalist leader Bal Thackeray, the news agency said. Thirty-two crude bombs were also recovered today.

The Bombay bomb blasts have been blamed on Muslim members of the city's under-

In March and April police seized about 3.5 tonnes of high-powered explosives identical to those used in the blasts which ripped through prominent commercial landmarks including the Bombay House, Air India headquarters, hotels and markets.

Another report says, Pakistan edged further into political turmoil today as another important aide with ministerial rank quit Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's team.

Roedad Khan, a long-time close friend of President Ghulam Ishaq Khan, was the eighth person with ministerial rank to step down over Sharif's trial of strength with the President whose powers he wants curbed.


