

ISLAMABAD, Apr 18: Pakistan President Ghulam Ishaq Khan dissolved the National Assembly late today and sacked Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif, accusing him of corruption and malpractices, report AFP,

Seven lakh sit for SSC exams today

The Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examinations, 1993, begin today (Monday) under all four Secondary Education Boards of the country - Dhaka, Comilla, Rajshahi and Jessore.

A total of 679010 students, of them 434895 male and 244115 female will sit for this year's examinations in 616 centres under the four boards.

This year, five centres have been set up abroad in Jeddah, Riyadh, Abu Dhabi, Doha and Tripoli for students living outside the country.
