**'Tourism industry can help create job opportunities'**

Bangladesh has tremendous potential for creating employment opportunities and earning foreign exchange through expansion of tourism industry, reports BSS.

This was stated by Habibur Rahman, Secretary, Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism in the certificate awarding ceremony of the first phase courses of 1992 held at National Hotel and Tourism Training Institute here yesterday.

Col (Retd), Bazul Ghani Patwary BP, Chairman, Bangladesh Parjatan Corporation presided over the function. Management Coordinator, UNDP and ILO, J.L. Bingley and Principal of the institute, M J Jahangir also spoke on the occasion.

Habibur Rahman said the present government had recognised tourism as an industry through declaration of the National Tourism Policy in 1992. It was a neglected sector in the past, he added. He hoped that National Hotel and Tourism Training Institute would play a more positive role in implementing the tourism policy through creation of skilled manpower for the industry. He expressed gratitude for the technical assistance of the UNDP and ILO for the expansion of the institute.

The Chairman of Bangladesh Parjatan Corporation informed that the institute had trained over nine thousand trainees in the different disciplines of tourism. Majority of them have been employed 'at home and abroad, he said adding they are earning fame and valuable foreign currency for the country.

**551 Bangladeshis overstay in Australia**

Bangladeshis topped among 63 countries at the end of last year with an overstay rate of 8.2 per cent, reports UNB.

According to Australian Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs, Bangladeshis are more likely to overstay their visas than visitors from any other country.

The total number of Bangladeshis overstayers in Australia now stands at 551. The figure released by the Immigration Department also shows that the number also rose by 21 per cent between April and December 1992.

Bangladesh is ahead of its nearest rival, Pakistan, which had an overstay rate of only 5.2 per cent.

Only 4 other countries (Togo, Yugoslavia, Vietnam and China) had overstay rates higher than 3 per cent.

The Australian Minister for Immigration recently announced tough new measures to crack down on overstayers and on visitors working illegally, said an Australian High Commission press release here yesterday.

The Australian High Commissioner, Richard Gate said "Australia takes this problem very seriously, and is determined not to become a haven for illegal immigrants."

Government of Australia is also exploring means to impose a strong barrier to illegal employment, and to help employers identify those without a right to work.

It will impose heavy fines against persons working without permission.

RAJSHAHI, Apr 23: Members of 20 Rifle Battalion seized 1144 pieces of Indian printed cotton saree from a passenger train at Ullapara Rail Station under Sirajganj district yesterday, reports BSS.

Acting on secret information the BDR members led by Captain Md Habibur Rahman seized the sarees left unclaimed at the Dhaka bound inter-city train Padma. However, some smugglers flew away with some other bundles of saree when the train stopped at the outer signal of the station.

Later, the sarees were deposited at Rajshahi customs office.

He became a professor in 1970 and also served as Dean of the Science Faculty. He was Provost of Zahurul Haq Hall.

Since his retirement in 1991 Prof Ali Nawab was working as a part time teacher of the department.

His Namaz-e-Janaza will be held tomorrow (Sunday) after Zohr prayers at the Dhaka University central mosque.

A group of five to six unidentified youngmen demanded Tk 5,000 as toll from the owner of the house on April 19. They snatched ornaments and other valuables as he failed to give them the toll money.


Presided over by Maulana Abdus Sukkur the session was addressed by a number of Islamic leaders, scholars, researchers and widely reputed maulanas.
