Rabindra-Nazrul birth anniversary programmes

The Ministry of Cultural Affairs has chalked out elaborate programmes to celebrate Rabindra-Nazrul birth anniversary on Baisakh 25 (May 8) and Jaistha 11 (May 25) in Dhaka, reports BSS.

State Minister for Cultural Affairs Prof Jahannara Begum told a press conference at her office yesterday that an eight-day programme has been chalked out to celebrate the occasion in the capital.

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia is expected to inaugurate the programme on May 8 and 25, which will be broadcast live in radio and television.

The minister said a 57-member committee with herself as its patron has been formed to organise the programmes. Secretary of the Ministry of Cultural Affairs IU Malik is the president of the committee.

Taka 20 lakh has been allocated to organise the programmes, the state minister said.

Prof Jahannara said eminent Rabindra and Nazrul experts and artists will take part in seminars, discussions, musical soirees, dramas and Rabindra-Nazrul melas, arranged on the occasion at the auditoriums of Bangla Academy, Shilpakala Academy, National Museum and Nazrul Institute.

Director General of Bangla Academy Prof Harunur Rashid, told a newsmen that the academy will publish a four volumes of Nazrul works on May 25.

Deal with int'l issues in balanced manner, speakers urge US

Speakers at a lecture session on American foreign policy yesterday urged the United States to deal with international issues in the unipolar world in a "balanced and equitable" manner to ensure global peace, reports UNB.

The end of cold war has placed the US in a unique position of promoting values like human rights and democracy for a "secure world", they observed in their comments on the lecture delivered by an American professor.

Termining the Serbian persecution of Bosnian Muslims as "menace to human civilisation", the speakers said the United States should play more active role in resolving the crisis.

The lecture on "The Eagle Unbound? US Foreign Policy in the Post-Cold War Era" was given by Prof Glen Johnson, Director of the American Studies Research Centre in Hyderabad, India.

Held at the Centre of Advanced Social Science Research of Dhaka University,

the session was presided over by DU Vice Chancellor Prof Emajuddin Ahmed. Distinguished scholars and academics participated in discussion on the lecture, organised by DU International Relations Department in cooperation with Bangladesh Association of American Studies and USIS in Dhaka.

"Though the cold war has come to an end, the US is not unbound, and its foreign policy is now more constrained than ever before," Prof Johnson said, adding a "New World Order," coined by former President George Bush after the Gulf War envisaging more peaceful and stable world, was overoptimistic.

Johnson, however, said there was growing consensus in the US, particularly after the presidential election, to reduce its global involvement and concentrate on domestic problems.

President Bill Clinton, who won the election with the pledge to concentrate more on

domestic problems, is handicapped by this commitment in dealing with the Bosnian crisis. Glen Johnson, who is also a Professor of Vaasar College in New York, said the US had created a lot of defence infrastructures during the cold war era, which could not be dismantled soon.

He said President Bill Clinton took a "moderate stand" in the debate and stressed the need to involve American allies in any effort to deal with the existing international problems.

Responding to a comment, the American professor said the US did not favour disintegration of any large state indicating India and China.

Replying to another question, he said American analysts were giving serious thoughts to rise of "Islamic fundamentalism" in the world, but did not perceive it as a global threat.

In his presidential speech, VC Emajuddin Ahmed said the end of the cold war unfolded many changes in international politics.

Sink differences to boost production : Mosharraf

Energy and Mineral Resources Minister Dr Khandaker Mosharraf Hossain yesterday stressed the need for a national consensus to lead the country towards prosperity through rejuvenating the economy by solving existing problems and inviting new investments, reports BSS.

"Let us forget our differences and join hands with each other in the greater interest of the national economy which will help us to attract new investment in various fields," he said, adding development would not be possible without national consensus on it.

The Energy Minister was addressing as the chief guest a seminar at the National Press Club with Prof Yeazuddin Ahmad in the chair. It was also addressed by CPB leader Shamsuddoha MP, Mahmudur Rahman Manna of Awami

League, Hajera Sultana of Bangladesher Workers Party and Kazi Akram Hossain of Ganatantrik Forum.

The key-note paper was presented by Delwar Hossain at the seminar which was organised by 'May Day Observance Committee' on the occasion of the historic May Day.

Speakers paid tributes to the memory of those killed by police firing at the Hay Market of Chicago on May 1, 1886 and also those made supreme sacrifices during various democratic struggles in the country.

They also expressed their deep shock at the tragic death of Sri Lankan President Ranasinghe Premadasa in a bomb explosion in Colombo on May 1 when he was leading a parade to observe the day in Sri Lanka.
