464 industrial units in six cstates of five greater districts of Raishahi Division. Of those, work on 339 units has so far been completed and 124 units are now in operation. Among those, 86 industrial

units are in greater Rajshahi

district including Natore, 34 in greater Bogra, 88 in greater Pabna, 10 in greater Rangpur, six in greater Dinajpur and 44 in Saidpur.

Entrepreneurs of this region said the units that were

closed down faced shortage of funds, marketing crisis, lack of skilled manpower and frequent loadshedding.

Sale of bidis without bandrolls in all the six thanas of the district is going on unabated, causing huge loss of revenue to the government.

Sale of bidis has also increased in recent days as prices of different brands of cigarettes have risen.

As per existing law, Taka 37 must be paid as excise duty for

each 100 packets of bidis. But the owners of the bidi factories are violating the law by nor putting the bandrolls on their

products. Bidi factory owners are also alleged to use forged or used bandrolls. They also conceal their actual production figures to evade government duties.

Local people allege that bidi factories owners are carrying out such evil practices with the help of some dishonest government officials.

## Sunderbans Forest Deptt to get wireless system

From Staff Correspondent KHULNA, May 2: After long 23 years the Sundarbans Forest Department is going to be equipped with wireless communication system to

protect the 2200-square miles of forest.
During the Liberation War the wireless communication system was destroyed. Earlier, the Sundarbans forest had five wireless sets in four range headquarters- Sharankhola, Chandpai, Shatkhira and Khulna to control 16 area offices

According to a highly placed source in the Forest Department five wireless sets have been procured by the department and will be installed soon. The UNDP has financed

and 39 patrol camp offices.

the project, the source added. The source pointed out that to cope with the rising trend in crimes inside the Sundarbans, the department should have at least 20 wireless sets and 60 walkie talkie sets.

A divisional level officer emphasised on at least eight speed boats for better communication and transportation of men and material linking all the area offices under the four range headquarters. At present only one speed boat out of the existing five is in running condition.

NARAIL, May 2: Prospect of ground nut cultivation in Lohagara and Kalia thanas of the district is very bright, re-

Farmers of char areas of both the thanas of Madhumati river belt have achieved a very encouraging yield of ground nut with the help of Agricultural Extension Department.

About 60 maunds of raw ground nut worth Taka 10,000 are produced in per acre at a production cost of Taka 1,000

Sandy soil with less productivity is suitable for cultivation of ground nut both in kharif and rabi seasons and only 130 days are required to harvest the corp.

Encouraged by the high yield, local peasants have decided to grow this cash crop.

Meanwhile, a scheme has been undertaken to cultivate ground nut in 2,000 acres of land in the current season in the district.

### **Bullock shortage** hampers cultivation

Another copy adds: Acute shortage of bullock has been prevailing throughout the district hampering cultivation to a great extent, reports UNB.

About 60 to 70 per cent families have no bullock to till their lands. Consequently 60 per cent land in the district remain uncultivated resulting in poor production every year. sources said.

Most of the farmers carry on agricultural work on share basis as they can not afford to buy bullocks due to abject

Farmers hire bullock to till their lands at high prices Sometimes they till the lands with spades. Finding no other alternative, they use milch cows to cultivate the lands re sulting in gradual reduction in the production of milk.

Besides, every year various diseases take a heavy toll of cattle. In addition, a good number of cattle in the district died due to flood last year.

Local people alleged that greedy cobblers poison cows and bullocks to death in differ ent parts to take skins Meanwhile, poor and marginal farmers are selling out their cows and bullocks due to shortage of fodder which is persisting in the district for a

long time. Taking advantage of the situation, cattle traders are buying hundreds of cows and bullock from the farmers at fhrow away prices. On the contrary, slaughtering of bullock has increased following scarcity of fish in the local markets.

Local people fear that if this process continues for an indefinite period cultivation will be hampered greatly. They urged the district administration to arrange credit facilities for the farmers to enable them to purchase bullock immediately.

# Carbon tax may slash oil prices, hit producers

proposed Western carbon tax might bring a crash in oil prices and throw the economics of the petroleum producing countries into chaos, yesterday's Gulf News quoted a study of the UAE industrial back as saying, reports Xinhua.

The study urged the oil

producing countries to take deterrent measures by imposing similar tax on imports from industrial countries.

US President Bull Clinton has proposed to levy about 3.5 US dollar on each barrel of imported oil by 1997. Industrial countries believe that tax on crude will help reduce consumption of carbon-based fuels which release carbon dioxide into the air.

The study predicted that industrial countries would reap about 90 billion dollar annually by imposing the tax, which would help reduce their

ABU DHABI, May 2: The deficits and drop the value of their oil imports due to a decrease in local consumption and a probable slide in oil

it said the oil producers would resort to international stock markets controlled by industrial countries for loans to cover their budget\_deficits and implement some necessary projects.

The panic caused by the carbon tax will also push many countries to pump more oil into the international markets which will further deteriorate the already low oil prices, the study added.

On April 13, 27 oil ministers and representatives of the 12-member Organization of **Petroleum Exporting Countries** (OPEC) and other oil producers outside the cartel discussed in Oman the energy taxation proposed by Western oil consuming countries.
