against 778 vessels, up from 48,85,129 tonnes against 713 ships during the corresponding period of 91-92 fiscal. The port officials attributed


the increase in traffic to rise in both export and import car-Official reports say, from

China's reforms hurt job sector

BEIJING, May 7: An official report said Wednesday that China's move toward marketoriented reforms is exposing a huge redundant workforce and the government fears unrest as increasing numbers of laid-off workers can't find jobs, reports AP.

Only 40 per cent of those out of work found new jobs last year, down from 60 per cent in 1991, the China Daily said.

their workers. Ninety percent of large and medium sized state enterprises have opened scrvice companies such as gas stations and small convenience stores to employ laid-off work-

Now huge numbers of surplus workers are being fired as the system of lifelong employ ment is dismantled.
