Dainik Bangla, Times get maximum govt ads

 The Dainik Bangla and The Bangladesh Times, both government owned dailies, received the highest amount of government advertisements for the Bengali and English categories during the first nine months of fiscal 1992-93 (July-March).
 Dainik Bangla received advertisements of Taka 1,20,25,464 while The Bangladesh Times got Taka 73,37,356.19 worth of advertisements.
 This was disclosed by Information Minister Barrister Nazmul Huda at the Jatiya Sangsad Sunday in reply to a question by Awami League MP Alhaj Syed Abul Hossain.
 Among the non-government newspapers, The Daily Inquilab got the largest share advertisements as a Bengali newspaper while The Telegraph, a publication of the Inquilab group topped the list among English newspapers.
 The Inquilab earned a sum of Taka 75,41,062 while The Telegraph got Taka 10,10,626.20 from government advertisements.
 The Daily Ittefaq, the largest circulated Bengali daily, got Taka 27,20,177 worth of advertisements. The Daily Star, The New Nation and The Morning Sun got advertisements just over Taka eight lakh each.

Tariq urges the rich to help the have-nots

Social Welfare and Women Affairs Minister Tariqul Islam yesterday called upon the wealthy people in the society to dedicate a part of their resources for the welfare of the distressed people, reports BSS.
 Speaking as the chief guest at a discussion organised by "Shahayok", a nongovernment voluntary organisation, the minister said it was the duty and responsibility of the rich to come forward with a big heart to help the have-nots improve their lot.
 Presided over by the convener of the organisation Rina Rahman the discussion was held at the Jatiya Press Club auditorium here. Hena Kabir and Dr Zohra Kazi also spoke.
 The minister said there were 16,000 voluntary social welfare organisations throughout the country registered with the Ministry of Social Welfare.
 He said the government with its limited resources would continue to support the voluntary organisations which would work for the welfare of the people.

UNICEF okays \$ 120m country programme

The Executive Board of UNICEF has approved a \$ 120 million US dollars country programme for Bangladesh for 1993-95, reports UNB.
 The approval on the country programme of cooperation was given at the Board's meeting in New York last week.
 An ambitious set of goals has been formulated through the programme, including the substantial reduction of both infant and maternal mortality rates, the increase in primary school enrolment and completion rates and improved sanitation coverage.
 The UNICEF Board noted recent successes of the government of Bangladesh in EPI, contraceptive prevalence, provision of safe water supply and the progressive drug policy.
 The programme funds have been allocated in the following manner: health and nutrition 33 per cent, education 25 per cent, water and environmental sanitation 20 per cent and the remainder to integrated basic services, communication and programme development.
 The Board observed that the high level political commitment to programmes is also evident from other government actions. Bangladesh was among the first to ratify the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and participated in the World Summit for children in 1990.
 The 27 global goals formulated at the Summit have been adapted and translated into a National Programme of Action for children in Bangladesh.
 The country Programme of Cooperation is implemented by social sector ministries and their affiliate agencies. The active participation of NGOs is encouraged and coordination is maintained with other UN agencies and development partners, the UNICEF Board observed.

Employer, worker better ties stressed

Labour and Manpower Minister Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan yesterday underscored the need for a healthy relationship between workers and employers for sound economic and social development in the country, reports BSS.
 The Minister was addressing a workshop on "Application of Standards" organised by Employers Association in collaboration with ILO held at Metropolitan Chamber. He said the present government was in the process of institutionalizing democracy aiming at more freedom for the people and to the society as a whole.

Dhaka to work together with Hungary for better ties

The Ambassador-designate of the Republic of Hungary Laszlo Varkonyi presented his credentials to President Abdur Rahman Biswas at Bangabhaban yesterday, reports BSS.
 Accepting the credentials, President Biswas said Bangladesh and Hungary would work together in greater strides towards forging greater bonds of friendship and cooperation.
 President Biswas said the present government had been consolidating the roots of democratic institutions in Bangladesh and making ceaseless efforts for comprehensive socio-economic development of the people.
 He said Bangladesh had been watching with great interest the momentous change taking place in Hungary for building a democratic, more developed and happier society.
 President Biswas assured the envoy of all possible assistance and cooperation in the performance of his tasks in Bangladesh.
 Varkonyi conveyed greetings and best wishes from the President of Hungary Arpad Goncz to President Biswas.
 The envoy said his country had attached great importance to the political, economic and cultural contacts with Bangladesh since establishing diplomatic relations.
 Earlier, on arrival at Bangabhaban, the ambassador was given a guard of honour by the President Guard Regiment. He took salute and inspected the guard.

Red Crescent Day observed in Khulna

KHULNA, May 9: International Red Crescent Day was observed here in Khulna city as elsewhere in the country in a befitting manner. This year's theme of International Red Crescent and Red Cross Day is "Respect for All," reports BSS.
 A discussion was held in this connection under the auspices of Khulna branch of Family Planning Association of Bangladesh at its office yesterday with principal Mazharul Hannan, Assistant Secretary General of the association in the chair. The discussion was participated, among others, by Nurul Islam, Mujibur Rahman and Tapon Mitra.
 Principal Mazharul Hannan in his presidential speech called for materialising the theme of this year's Red Crescent Day and also called upon all to come forward with a zeal to help the poor and down-trodden people of the country.
