Shahidullah dead

Principal AKM Shahidullah, President of Bangladesh College Teachers Federation, died of massive heart attack yesterday at the Suhrawardy hospital.

His Namaj-e-Janaja will be held today (Tuesday) after Asr prayer at Sheikh Borhanuddin College premises and after Maghreb at Baiful Mokarram Mosque.

He will be buried tomorrow (Wednesday) at the family graveyard in his village home at Gunpur of Daudkandi thana in Comilla District.

Principal Shahidullah left behind wife, a daughter, two sons and host of relatives and admirers to mourn his death.

Death condoled

President Abdur Rahman Biswas expressed deep shock and sorrow at the untimely death of AKM Shahidullah Principal of Sheikh Borhanuddin College and Secretary General Bangladesh Private College Teachers Association who died of a heart attack yesterday.

In a condolence message the President said Principal Shahidullah was a dedicated educationist who always fought for the cause of education and teaching community.

He conveyed deep sympathy to the member of the bereaved family and prayed for peace of the departed soul.

State Minister for Education Principal Mohammad Yunus yesterday expressed deep grief at the death of Secretary-General of Bangladesh Sikhak Samity Federation and Principal of Sheikh Borhanuddin College, AKM Shahidullah.

He recalled the contribution of the deceased to the welfare of the teachers' community.

The State Minister prayed for the salvation of the departed soul and expressed his deep sympathy with the members of the bereaved family.

Shaikh Amanullah, President and Azizul Huq Shah, Secretary General of Bangladesh Teachers Association expressed their deep sorrow at the sudden death of principal Shahidullah, reports BSS.

They expressed sympathy to the members of the bereaved family and prayed for the peace of departed soul.

23 arrested in city

Chinese entrepreneurs urged to invest in Bangladesh

The visiting Minister for LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Abdus Salam Talukdar has called upon the Chinese entrepreneurs to invest in Bangladesh on a bigger scale taking advantage of the government's liberal industrial policy, according to a report received here, says BSS.

He said the present government of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia has put in place a comprehensive policy package to create a favourable investment in the country.

Barrister Talukdar made this call while addressing the Commission of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation of the Xiamen Special Economic Zone in southern China yesterday.

He said Bangladesh has a good number of trained manpower and abundant supply of raw materials which with the inputs of capital and en-

trepreneurship would be able to produce competitively priced goods for the world market. So, investment in Bangladesh would ensure an attractive rate of profit for foreign investors, he added.

The Minister said it would also be good demonstration of China's abiding friendship with Bangladesh.

Earlier, on their arrival at the special zone, the delegation members were received by the provincial chief of the Communist Party of China and the local administration. The delegates were taken round the newly developed areas of Xiamen special economic zone. The Director of the zone explained to them the working of the zone and its future plan of attracting high-tech industries there.

Barrister Salam Talukdar who is also the Secretary-

General of BNP accompanied by Chowdhury Tanveer Ahmed Siddiqui, Vice Chairman, BNP, and other members of the delegation are now on a visit to China at the invitation of the Communist Party of China.

Addressing another meeting with the chief executives of the leading enterprises of the Xiamen Special Economic Zone the delegation members gave a resume of the potential of Bangladesh in the areas of investment and export, and facilities provided by the government to the foreign investors.

The Bangladesh delegation also visited Guangzhou, another leading industrial and business center in south China and discussed with business leaders the ways of strengthening economic and commercial ties between the two countries.

Bonn to give Dhaka Tk 20cr food aid

Bangladesh will receive 15,000 metric tons of soft wheat worth about Taka 20 crore from Germany under an agreement signed in Dhaka Monday, reports UNB.

German Ambassador Dr Karl-Heinz Scholtyssek and Joint Secretary of the Economic Relations Division (ERD) Nasiruddin Ahmed signed the agreement on behalf of their respective governments.

The food aid fulfils a commitment made by German side in 1992 in inter-governmental negotiations on development cooperation and efforts for poverty alleviation, Embassy officials said.

Of the wheat, a major part will be distributed free of charge under the Food for Works Project and Vulnerable Group Development Programme, they said.

Ministry of Relief sanctions Tk 32 lakh, 1920 tons of wheat

The Ministry of Relief yesterday sanctioned a total of 1920 metric tons of wheat and Taka 32 lakh in cash as relief to the 64 districts to face possible natural disasters and emergency situation, reports BSS.

Each district will get 30 metric tons of wheat and Tk 50 Thousand in cash. Deputy Commissioners will distribute wheat and cash during the current fiscal year after consulting with the concerned Parliament Members.

Besides, the Ministry of relief sanctioned 475 metric tons of wheat and Taka five lakh and fifty thousand in cash as relief for the distressed of 10 districts which were affected by the recent tornado and flood.

The district-wise break up of the sanction is: Moulvi Bazar-50 metric tons of wheat and Tk. one lakh in cash, Comilla, Feni, Sylhet, Kurigram, Madaripur, Jhenaidah, Dhaka and Netrokona each district will get 50 metric tons of wheat and Tk 50 thousand and Habiganj district will get 25 metric tons of wheat and Tk 50 thousand.

Abbas visits Segunbagicha canal

Mayor of Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) Mirza Abbas, MP, yesterday visited the site of Segunbagicha canal to see the progress of its re-excavation work, reports BSS.

A corporation press release said Mirza Abbas directed the concerned engineers to complete the work within the shortest possible time to reduce water stagnation in the city.

ROK donates books to DU

A set of 30 books, donated by South Korea for the Dhaka University Library were handed over to Emajuddin Ahmed, Vice-Chancellor of the University yesterday, reports UNB.

Prof Mizanur Rahim of the Department of Fine Arts, Chittagong University, will inaugurate the exhibition, an Alliance Francaise press release said today.

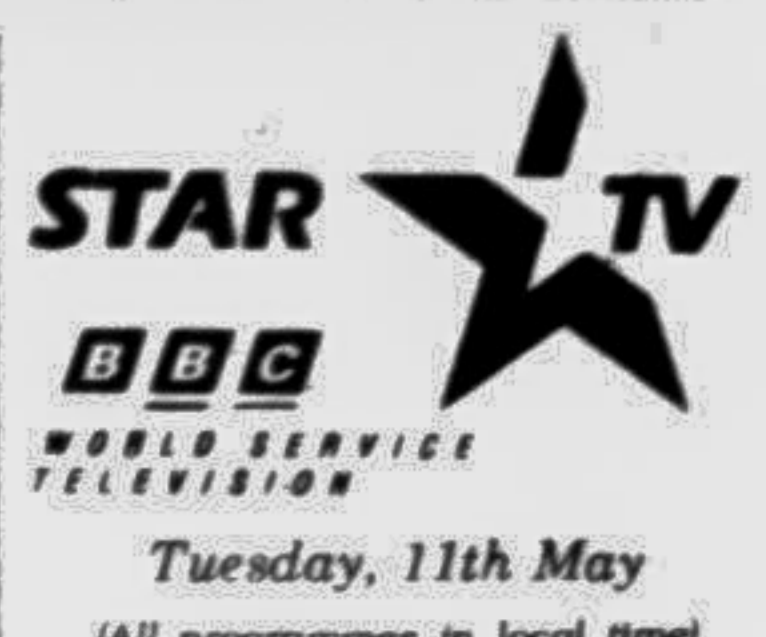
