They also demanded that the government should pay compensation for the families of the victims.

183 army personnel leave for Mozambique

The last batch of 183 army personnel including seven officers belonging to the Bangladesh Army contingent to the UNOMOZ left Dhaka for Mozambique early hours yesterday, reports BSS. The commanding officer of the infantry battalion of the Bangladesh Army Lt. Col. Fakhruddin Haider is leading the team. They were seen off at the Zia International Airport by senior army officers. The Bangladesh Army contingent to Mozambique comprises an infantry battalion, an engineers company, a logistic company, medical elements, military observers and staff officers. The contingent has a total of 1,320 army personnel including officers who will join the United Nations operations in Mozambique (UNOMOZ).

New marine academy not feasible, JS told

The establishment of a new marine academy will not be feasible because of its financial implication as well as for a declining trend of its demand, State Minister for Shipping Harun Ar Rashid told the Jatiya Sangsad Thursday night, reports BSS. Making a statement on a private member's resolution on the establishment of a marine academy in southern Khulna district he said in a country like United Kingdom the number of marine academy was being reduced. India and Pakistan also have one marine academy each, he added. Earlier, moving the resolution Dr Mozammel said the establishment of a marine academy in Khulna would help generate employment opportunity to the cadets passing out from there. The House, however, rejected the resolution. Awami League members Rahmat Ali and Dharendra Nath Sambu, and Jamaat-e-Islami member Sk Ansar Ali also spoke supporting the resolution. In his paper Clinton Bamberger dwelt on various aspects of the clinical legal education and said "the presence of the teaching lawyer to look after the welfare of the client gives the student lawyer confidence that she can do what she thinks best without harming the client." "Clinical practice gives the student lawyer the opportunity to practise under the protection of the teaching lawyer," he said.

Workshop on "Clinical Legal Education" begins

A two-day workshop on "Clinical Legal Education" began here yesterday as part of a process to develop skills of the law teachers and improve the standard of legal education in the country, reports BSS. Law teachers from the Dhaka University, Islamic University and various law colleges of the country are participating in the workshop organised jointly by Bangladesh Law Teachers Association and Bangladesh Bar Council. Two papers on the subject were presented at the workshop on the first day by Prof. Clinton Bamberger, a Full-bright Scholar from the United States, and Yubraj Sangroula, Director of Clinical Legal Education in the Tribhuvan University of Nepal. Attorney General Aminul Huq, Chairman of the Legal Education committee of the Bar Council Barrister Amirul Islam and Secretary General of the Association Barrister Shafiq Ahmed participated in the discussion.
