as patrons. Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman has been named the president of the organising committee with Azizul Huq. Secretary of the Ministry for Youth and Sports, as the organising secretary.

Shamsul Islam Khan, Minister for Industries, Information Minister Nazmul Huda, Jute Minister Hannan Shah, Planning Minister Zahiruddin Khan, Dhaka City Mayor Mirza Abbas and State Minister for Youth and Sports Sadek Hossain and BOA president Gias Kamal Chowdhury will act as vice-president in the committee.

# Miandad looks forward to next World Cup

KARACHI, May 21: Pakistan's master batsman Javed Miandad said today he has no plans to retire before the next World Cup to be staged in the subcontinent in 1996, reports

"If anyone thinks that through smear campaigns he can pressurise me into announcing early retirement from the game, he is sadly mistaken," the former Pakistan cricket captain said at an award ceremony.

"In fact my aim is to represent Pakistan in the 1996 World Cup and god willing it would be a record by itself because then I would be the only cricketer having played in all the six World Cup tournaments," he said.

"It would require any cricketer to play at least for a quarter century to beat that record," said Miandad, second highest scorer in one-day internationals and third highest Test aggregate, following Australia's Allan Border and India's Sunil Gavasker. He said during the intervening period he would also try to improve his Test and one-day aggre-

Miandad dispelled as "a mere fantasy and smear campaign" reported accusations by the former Pakistan fast bowler Sarfraz Nawaz that he threw away his bat irresponsibly during the recently concluded West Indian tour. Sarfraz has also reportedly accused Miandad of being involved with the "Gambling Mafia" to bring disrepute to the Pakistan team.

# Hafiz has only himself to blame

A Bangladesh nominee for international referees' examination has been barred from appearing in the test, BBF sources said, reports UNB.

The Bangladesh Basketball Federation (BBF) on Thursday banned Major Mohammad Atiqui Hafiz's participation in any competition, clinic, camp or seminar for two years for his alleged misbehaviour in the semifinals of the Bangladesh Games last December.

Earlier on May 15, the BBF nominated four candidates for appearing in the examination to be held in Kuala Lumpur from June 5-8, a rare opportunity for Bangladesh having no A grade referee. None but Major Atiqul responded and the Army Sports Control Board agreed to provide the expenses for him to appear in the test

It was learnt that Maj Atiqul, one of the four B grade referees recognised by the Federation of International Basketball Associations (FIBA). was barred from sitting for the test according to the recommendation of the Technical Committee.

# Bad neck forces Lewis to make the switch

NEW YORK, May 21 : Neck injuries sustained by Olympic champion Carl Lewis in a

car accident last February are preventing the Olympic champion from long jumping this year, his manager said on Thursday, reports

Joe Douglas, manager of the Santa Monica Track Club, confirmed that Lewis, a threetime Olympic champion in the long jump, would concentrate on the 100 metres and 200 metres this season, and attempt to compete in both races at the World Championships this summer in Stuttgart. "Carl was broadsided by an-

other automobile," Douglas said, describing the accident. "He had a problem with some tendons and a problem with his neck.

"He's fine now, but he's had back problems for a while, and he decided it was less strenuous for him if he didn't have to worry about take-offs and land ings for a while."

Douglas said that Lewis missed only a few days of train ing and called his decision precautionary. "I really just think he wanted to show people he wasn't too old to whip them in the sprint."

Lewis arrives in New York today and will compete at 100 metres in Saturday's New York Games, one of two US meetings on the Grand Prix circuit.

Also entered in the 100 are Mike Marsh, the Olympic champion at 200 metres. Calvin Smith, a two-time world 200 metres champion, and Canada's Bruny Surin, the world indoor champion at 60 metres. Lewis, 31, failed to qualify

for the Barcelona Games in ei-

ther the 100 or 200 metres at the US Olympic trials last summer. But Lewis still ran for gold as he anchored the 4X100 metre relay team to victory in world record time. The previous year, Lewis blazed to a world record 9.86 seconds in the 100 metres at
