National Economic Council (NEC) yesterday approved Tk 9.750 crore Annual Development Programme (ADP) for the next fiscal year (1993-94) marking a 20 per cent increase over the current year's allocation, reports UNB.

The Council at a meeting at the NEC building, chaired by the Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia, also approved the revised ADP budget of Tk 8,121 crore with local component of Tk 3,753 crore.

The ADP budget for FY 1993-94 include local currency of Tk 4,970 crore while project aid for the fiscal 1993-94 is Tk 4,780 crore.

### Dissolution of Pak NA: Verdict likely today and incompetence." ISLAMABAD, May 25: Pakis-

tan's Supreme Court, which must decide on the legality of National Assembly and sacking of Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif, will complete its hearings Wednesday, legal sources said here today, reports AFP.

The sources said the 11judge court could hand down its verdict in the crucial case on Wednesday when the petitioner's counsel Khalid Anwar winds up his arguments, or in the following days.

In his petition Sharif has appealed to the court to declare his April 18 dismissal by President Ghulam Ishaq Khan "Illegal and unconstitutional," claiming that the President's use of discretionary powers was "a whimsical act of personal vendetta."

Ishaq Khan, 78, accused Sharif of "corruption, nepotism

The court has been hearing the case on day-to-day basis last month's dissolution of the since May 8, with state Attorney General Aziz Munshi drawing out proceedings by taking almost a week to argue that the President was justified,

Munshi insisted that the situation had arisen in which effective government in accordance with the constitution had become impossible.

The lower house was dissolved following a three-month tussle between the President and the former Prime Minister on Sharif's attempts to curtail the President's powers.

Suspense over the verdict has all but paralysed other political activity in Pakistan, with some speculating that a verdict in favour of Sharif could force the President to step down, and others, predicting Ishaq Khan could try to declare a state of emergency.
