### Football league from June 11

A new look First Division football league will commence at the Dhaka Stadium from June 11. This was decided at the meeting of the league committee held at the Dhaka Metropolis Football Association (DMFA) office with Shahidul Islam Chowdhury in the chair.

League this year will be played under a completely new format with the top ten finishers of last year's league playing in a premier league while the last eight and the two promoters fighting it out in another tier known as First Division league.

East End, an old club with fairly good records in Senior Division league, won back the right to play in the Senior Division once again along with Bangladesh Boys who are to bear the brunt of the big league for the first time.

Abahani Krira Chakra, the reigning champions and Mohammedan Sporting Club, their arch rivals who finished runners-up, would start as the routine favourites for this year's title.

Organised by the DMFA, the Senior Division football league is sponsored by Bangladesh Tobacco Company, who has entered into a three-year contract to finance the major sporting attraction of the country. Last year's league was named Star First Division football league after one of the products of the sponsors.

### Hafiz appeals against ban

Bangladesh nominee for International Referee Examination, earlier barred from appearing in the test by Bangladesh Amateur Basketball Federation (BAAF), has appealed against the ban, reports UNB.

The BAAF on Thursday banned Major Mohammad Atiqul Hafiz, a basketball coach of Bangladesh Army, from participating in any competition, clinic, camp or seminar for two years for his alleged misbehaviour in semifinal of Bangladesh Games last December.

Atiq in his appeal to the ministry has prayed for reconsidering his case and allow him to appear in the test for which Bangladesh Army will bear all expenses.

Earlier on May 15, the BAAF nominated Major Atiq as one of the four candidates for the examination, a rare opportunity for Bangladesh having no grade-A referee.

None but Atiq responded for the examination to be held in Kuala Lumpur from June 5-8 and all formalities including clearance from the Chief of Staff was completed.

It was learnt that Atiq, one of the four B-grade referees recognised by the Federation of International Basketball Association (FIBA), was barred from sitting for the test according to the recommendation of the Technical Committee on May 20.

### Papin's injury worries Milan

MUNICH, May 25: Jean-Pierre Papin failed to win the European Champions Cup with Olympic Marseille. On Wednesday, he can do it with AC Milan — against his former club.

Assuming he plays, There's a possibility Papin will not be on the field — and may not even be on the bench when Milan and Marseille clash for European soccer's top prize for clubs, the Champions Cup, at Munich's Olympic stadium, reports AP.

The French striker, who moved to Milan last year, was sidelined for one month by a pulled muscle. He played an unimpressive first half in Milan's 1-1 league draw at Cagliari on Friday and was substituted.

But Papin, who could be replaced by Daniele Massaro is only one of Milan's injury worries.

Ruud Gullit is nursing a pulled muscle and his fellow Dutch superstar Marco van Basten is in the early stage of a comeback after being sidelined between mid-December and early May.

Van Basten, three-time winner of the Golden Ball prize as the European player-of-the-year, underwent ankle surgery to remove some cartilage.

Before the operation, he had scored 12 goals in as many league games, and hit four in a Champions Cup match against Swedish champ IFK Goteborg.

Since his comeback, Van Basten has played one full league match, scoring one goal, and was rested in Cagliari because he still feels some slight pain in the operated right ankle.

Gullit is likely to end up on the bench — or even in the stands if coach Fabio Capello decides to name Papin.

The third Dutchman on Milan's team, Frank Rijkaard, is fit and sure to start.

The Dutch trio played a crucial role in delivering the Champions Cup to Milan in 1989 and 1990.

Gullit and Van Basten scored two goals each against Steaua Bucharest in 1989, and Rijkaard scored the winning goal against Benfica one year later.

Fading form is also adding to Milan's worries.

After a sensational league start that helped Milan stretch the unbeaten streak to a record 58 games, the team went into a slump, winning only one of its last 10 league games and getting knocked out of the Italian Cup.
