SYLHET, May 26: At least 70 persons had been died of diarrhoea in different areas of Beanibazar and Balagani thanas under Sylhet and Jagannathpur and Tahirpur thanas under Sunamganj districts during the last few weeks. Unofficial sources claimed the casualty

Besides more than 2,000 others had also been suffering from the different diarrhoeal diseases in the said thanas.

The affected thanas, severely hit by the floods this year had also been lacking necessary supply of medicines in the government hospital and Health Complexes, it is al-

In Balaganj thana 25 persons including 16 children died of diarrhoea. The affected areas are in Dewanbazar. Sherpur, Goalabazar, Omarpur, Burunga and Pashchim Pailanpur. There is an acute scarcity of Oral Saline and

other medicines in the Balaganj Thana Health Complex for a long. Everyday, a large number of people are not getting proper medicines and treatments in the hospital, it is reported.

In Beanibazar thana, ten persons died of diarrhoea during the last two weeks. The diseases had been

10,000 hectares of crops under water in Sherpur

SHERPUR, May 26: About Shariatpur and Faridpur. 10,000 hectares of Irri and boro paddy in the district went under water due to heavy downpour for the last four days and onrush of water from Garo hill areas, reports UNB.

Local Agriculture Extension Department officials said 2,344 hectares of Irri-boro and 2,910 hectares of aus paddy in Nalitabari thana, 2,730 hectares of Irri-boro in Nokla thana and 3,200 hectares of Irri-boro and 1,500 hectares of aus in Jhenaigati thana went under water during the period.

Three people were killed by lightning and at least 10 people were injured in house collapse in Jhenaigati thana during the period.

About 1,000 thatched houses were razed to the ground due to strong wind and incessant rain.

Water levels in all the rivers of the district registered a sharp rise but still are flowing below the danger level.

Principal crops like aman paddy and wheat are also being sold at low throw away prices this year. Aman paddy is selling between 110 and Taka 140 per maund while wheat is being sold between Taka 155 and Taka 160 per maund.

started though the rate has been fixed at Taka 225 per

> Farmers are passing their days in great hardship. Most of them are lossing interest in cultivation as they are being deprived of the reasonable price of their products, local people said.

The century-old Victoria High School of Sirajganj town is under fathoms of problems. It was established in 1898 after the name of Queen Victoria, the then Queen of England and Empress of India, on the occasion of 50 years of

by the Calcutta University in 1900. The Queen of England donated 32 volumes of Encyclopaedia for the school library. The physical infrastructure of the school includes 15 classrooms, headmaster's office, teacher's commonroom, library, laboratory, play ground, pond and hostel on 4.33 acres In 1919, the then Zamindar

constructed the Motilal Bhaban of the school. Then in 1933, Roy Bahadur Kalidas Chowdhury, Zaminder of Shohagpur, constructed magnificent looking-building in memory of his departed son Gopal Chowdhury, which has changed very little during the last 60 years. The south-facing Gopal Memorial Hall and the west-facing Motilal Bhaban need immediate repair. The buildings are now in a precarious condition and may collapse any time causing harm to lives and property. Plants have umes of Victorian Encyclopaedia, History of he world and a number of English translations of the Holy Quran. The number of books are insufficient for about 750 students from class III to X. Some rare collection of the library were looted by the occupation army in 1971 during the glorious Liberation War. Mr. Brojendra Lal Roy and

Mr. Shrish Chandra Roy were the founding secretary and the founding headmaster of the school respectively. A considerable number of renowned personalities once read in Victoria High School. They include Dr. G. R. Hilali, former central Minister of Pakistan, Mr. Abdullah-Al- Mahmood, former Principal of Dhaka College, Professor Abul Hossain, Mathematician Mr. Nalini Kanta Chakrabarty, a Professor of California University, S M Mahbubul Alam, Political Scientist Maniruzzaman Talukder, Scientist Dr Kudrat e-Khuda, Dr. Lutfar Rahman, Economist Dr. Solaiman Hossain Mandal and Dr. Manmath Nath Bhaduri.

Tuition fees collected from the students do not cover the recurring expenditure of the school resulting in the closure of magazine publication for a long time. The play ground of
