Mahananda Bridge will be

opened to traffic June 23 RAJSHAHI, June 6: China-Bangladesh Friendship Bridge-3 When Cows and Goats Take known as Mahananda Bridge

will be opened to traffic on June 23, reports BSS. Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia laid the foundation sto-

ne of the Bridge at Rehar-char under Chapainawabganj Pourashaba on August 29, 1991. Prime Minister Begum Kha-

leda Zia is expected to formally open the Mahananda Bridge on June 23.

The 448.30-metre long and 7.32 metre wide Mohananda Bridge has been constructed at a cost of about Taka fifty crore including Taka 25 crore provided by China as project aid.

The bridge will have 10 kms of approach road and 1.30 metre footpath on both sides.

The work on the bridge started in February 92 and is expected to be completed by June 15 four months ahead of schedule time.

The two other China-Bangladesh friendship bridges are Buriganga Bridge in Dhaka and Shombhuganj Bridge in Mymensingh.

About 265 Ghinese workers including 65 Chinese experts and over 100 Bangladeshi technical experts have worked day and night to complete the work of the bridge.

Depression over North Bay likely this month

One or two monsoon depression is likely over the North Bay during the current month, according to a Met Office forecast, reports UNB.

The long-range forecast also predicted moderate flash flood over Sylhet region in the middle of June and over Chittagong region in the last part of the month.

On rainfall, the forecast said that Chittagong division is likely to have the highest 575-625 mm, followed by 425-475 mm in Barisal division.

Dhaka division may have 375-425 mm rainfall while Rajshahi division 350-400 mm and Khulna division 300-350 mm during the month.

In last month, Chittagong division had the highest 508 mm rain, followed by Dhaka division 339 mm, Barisal division 228, Rajshahi division 222 mm and Khulna division 163 mm.
