cut recruitment in '94

TOKYO, June 8: Fifty-six per cent of 300-listed major Japanese companies say they intended to cut their recruitment of new graduates in 1994, while only five per cent expected to hire more, the Asahi Shimbun said in a survey pub-

lished Monday, reports AFP. The figures compared to a similar survey conducted by the newspaper last year, which showed 36 per cent of companies would cut recruitment, while seven per cent would increase hiring.

The Asahi poll also showed that of the firms polled, 1.3 per cent were not planning on hiring graduates next year. The firms included Japan Airline Co Ltd, Minolta Camera Co Ltd, Cosmo Securities Co Ltd and Hyogo Bank Ltd.

The survey did not give a reasons for the recruitment cutbacks, but the effects of the

global recession have forced many Japanese firms to cut back spending and expansion

Additionally, the rapid rise of the yen has hit export-oriented businesses especially electronics and automobile manufac-

The survey said electronics giant Sony Corp would cut its 1994 recruitment by half the number of graduates employed this year to 500. Mitsubishi Electric Corp, said it planned to reduce the number by 40 per cent to 1,370, while Matsushita Electric Industrial Co Ltd plans to hire 1,600 graduates, down 20 per cent.

In the automotive industry, Nissan Motor Co said it would cut new hirings by 60 per cent of 850 positions, Honda Motor Co by half to 275 and Toyota Motor Corp by about 10 per cent to 2, 150.

ICCO struggling for existence

LONDON, June 8: Delegates of the International Cocoa Organisation (ICCO), meeting in London June 8 to June 11, face a "face against time" to prevent a collapse of the organisation and liquidation of its buffer stocks, ICCO spokeswoman Nicola Clayson said Monday, reports AFP

The ICCO delegates, from 40 countries around the world. have less than four months to agree a new international accord before the present one runs out at the end of September. Without a new agreement, the ICCO will be dissolved and the 230,000 tonnes of cocoa stocks built up to protect the market will be

During the meeting, the 18 main producer and 22 con-

sumer countries have to study a proposal put forward by ICCO Executive Director Edouard Kouame on a limited economic agreement based on a tight production policy and measures to encourage demand.

This 'alternative proposal" would 'avoid brutally cutting the ecoperation between the two groups, preserve the structure of the ICCO, and allow negotiations to restart at any time," he

A later meeting planned for Geneva "would be in prospect only if the two parties show a real will to co-operate," Clayson said. The delegates are in a race against time. A definite decision has to be taken before the end of September.

At the breakup of previous negotiations in Geneva, the Malaysian Peter Lai, President of United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) said the discussions should not restart if they were not serious about succeeding.

A meeting of the ICCO council has already been planned for September 9 to 17, should the talks fail, on temporary measures and the means of liquidating the stocks held by the ICCO.

After several thorny rounds of negotiations and the failure of the two sides to come together, delegates decided to stop their talks last March. They were unable to agree on an intervention price and the size of the stock withholding scheme and on financing the withdrawal mechanism.

Since 1986, the international cocoa price has collapsed to 680 pounds per tonne from 2,000 pounds eight years ago.

The international agreement signed in 1986, which was initially to end in September 1990, has been prolonged twice. Its economic clauses were suspended in February 1988.

Unemployment rate in EC rises to 10.4 pc

BRUSSELS, June 8: The rate of unemployment in the European Community (EC) rose by 0.1 point to 10.4 per cent of the workforce in April compared with the figure in March, official EC figures showed on Monday, reports AFP.

The revised figure for March was 10.3 per cent and the figure for April 1992 was 9.4 per cent. Spain was the only country to experience a reduction of un-

employment between March and April, when the rate fell from 21 per cent to 20.7 per In remained steady in

Britain at 11.4 per cent and in Ireland at 18.4 per cent. Other monthly changes

were: Germany up 0.2 per cent to 5.4 per cent, France up 0.1 per cent to 10.6 per cent, Belgium up 0.1 per cent to 9.2 per cent, Denmark up 0.1 per cent to 10.1 per cent, Italy up 0.1 per cent to 10.4 per cent, and Luxembourg up 0.1 per cent to 2.5 per cent.

Figures for Greece were not available, said Eurostat, the EC statistical institute which pub-

lished the figures. During the previous 12 said.

months the biggest increases were noted in Spain, where rate rose by 3.1 points, Belgium 1.1 points and Germany one point.

Four countries have rates higher that the average. They are Spain with 20.7 per cent, Ireland 18.4 per cent, Britain 11.4 per cent and France 10.6 per cent.

Luxembourg continued to have the lowest rate of 2.5 per cent, up from 1.9 per cent in April 1992.

Tokyo to give food aid to Palestinians

TOKYO, June 8: Japan will provide US produced wheat flour worth one billion yen (nine million dollar) in food aid for Palestinians both inside and outside the Israeli-occupied territories, the foreign ministry said Monday, reports AFP.

The assistance will be extended through the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestinian refugees in the Near East (UNRWA), the ministry
