





WASHINGTON, June 11: Jurgen Klinsmann scored his second goal in

Thursday as Germany rebounded from a 3-0 deficit to draw Brazil 3-3 in the US Cup friendly football tournament, reports AFP.

Substitute Michael Schulz throw-in bounced once and Klinsmann headed it past Brazilian keeper Taffarel in the final minute, a goal that Klinsmann called a reward for German perseverance.

We were rewarded with a goal in the last minute, but the important thing was to show we could keep up in the second half, he said. In the first, the Germans

could not quite keep pace with the speedy, skilful Brazilians.

consider resign

ation on Thursday following his team's shock 2-0 defeat to the United States, reports AFP. "The result was disappoint-

ing but the performance was encouraging," said Taylor, as he tried to play down the importance of England's second embarrassing defeat to the USA. They were also humiliated by the Americans 1-0 in 1951.

The English sporting press, however, were in competition to find the strongest terms of abuse following the national football team's latest defeat.

Taylor's team will struggle to reach the World Cup finals in America in 1994 following their 2-0 defeat to Norway in a qualifying match last week, but the manager still has the support of his employers.

Peter Swales, head of the FA International Committee, defended the England manager, saying he would remain in charge for the remaining World Cup matches. "Basically, the games we

have to win are the games in September, October and November," said Taylor. David Platt, England's in-

jured captain who watched from the sidelines, offered a show of solidarity with the manager. "We're all in it together," said

Platt, who hopes to be fit for England's next match against Brazil on Sunday. "At the end of the day, he is

responsible for results and we are responsible for performance. We could come out tomorrow night and play totally the same way and we could come away winners.


