### Dhaka's call to uphold human rights without dual standards

## US House body report faults our human rights situation

Members of the US House of Representatives Committee on Foreign Affairs feel disturbed by the State Department's assessment that the human rights situation in Bangladesh deteriorated last

The recommendations of the Committee, released recently, went on to add that the members "Wish to underscore the fact that democracy cannot survive in an atmosphere where the government is less than fully committed to the protection of individual human rights.'

The House Committee urged the Bangladesh government "to redouble its efforts

to guarantee that all Bangladeshis enjoy lives free from threats to their fundamental rights". The report, however, did not mention any detailed or specific instances.

The House of Representatives Subcommittee on Asia and Pacific released its recommendations on June in Washington and the report was made available to the press by the USIS in Dhaka yesterday. The Subcommittee, previously chaired by Congressman Stephan Solarz, is now headed by Congressman Gary Ackerman (Democrat, New York).




