Even so, they must bat for the whole of tomorrow's final day on a slow pitch offering turn to stop the Australian win that would give the touring side a 2-0 lead in the six-Test series.

England's second innings started with Gooch and Atherton surviving a new-ball burst from Merv Hughes, characteristically bristling with hostility, as they put on 71 before being parted in the second over after lunch.

The England captain pushed forward at a leg break from Shane Warne that took the outside edge and wicketkeeper Ian Healy held the catch after a slight fumble.




