## Poor Civic Sanitation In City

By A. S. M. Nurunnabi

Even to casual observers, it is apparent that the overall sanitary situation in the city is too deplorable. In some areas, a steady deterioration in the situation is noticeable, making the affected areas nauseating to approach. With the advent of the monsoon, the situation has aggravated. Outside the posh and semi-

posh areas in the newer parts of the city, there are very few areas in old Dhaka where the sanitary situation is free from complaint. In some areas, for example, near Jhigatola bazar, the sewers are blocked with pits over flowing, particularly in the rainy season. The overflow goes into the open sewers on either side of the road, subjecting the passers-by and neighbours to the torment of the overpowering stench. In such localities, the distinction between underground sewers for sewage and ordinary roadside drains meant mainly for rainwater disappears. There is another hazard: Some of the man-hole covers being missing, the over-flooding makes it impossible for the pedestrian and vehicular traffic to locate the open man-holes, thereby making themselves liable to fall into potential death-traps.

"We would like to seek cooperation in the general elections on the basis of fair com petition and trust," said SDPJ chairman Sadao Yamahana in the statement providing his reaction to the formation of the new party on Wednesday.

Komeito chairman Koshiro

Ishida went a step further and said he would endorse Hata as prime minister in a possible coalition government. He also predicted that the coming election would also see an end to the LDP's majority rule. But some political analysts and, not surprisingly, LDP stalwarts expressed their doubts if the opposition parties can form an alliance to set up a coalition government after the elections, considering their differences over major issues relat-

ing security and other areas. "Uncertainties remain about whether such a coalition can be created at all, or whether it can function beyond its presumed nature as an emergency

measure," wrote one analysts. The leading Asahi Shimbun daily also expressed skepticism over the real intentions of the newly floated party, Shinseito, in an editorial this week headlined "Shinseito's

game," it wrote and urged to keep the rebirth of politics free from disingenuousness.

Mutoboldly predicted that the opposition parties would be unable to form a ruling coalition after the polls because of policy differences.


