State Minister for Land Kabir Hossain said in Parliament yesterday that the government would take necessary steps to solve the country's age-old problems relating to land, reports UNB.

Winding up a debate on cutmotions on budgetary allocation of Tk 108,64,23,000 under the head "Land revenue for fiscal 1993-94", he termed the land issues a crucial national prob-

He said all issues concerning this problem would be brought up in the parliamentary committee before taking any deci-

The State Minister, however, added that the bad laws were to be dealt with first, otherwise no problem would be solved.

Earlier, participating in the debate on the cut-motions, opposition members demanded repeal of the Vested Property Act and curbing corruption in different directorates and offices under the Land Ministry.

Sharif had a rare meeting with President Ishaq Khan this morning and asked him to sack the Punjab Governor, Ishaq Khan refused.

The provincial parliament has reeled from crisis to crisis in the past few weeks as supporters of the beleaguered Prime Minister have battled his bitter foes -- backed by Ishaq Khan - for supremacy in Punjab, Sharif's main powerbase until his dismissal.

The official Associated Press of Pakistan (APP) quoted sources close to the President as saying that Ishaq Khan had nothing to do with the second dissolution of the Punjab Assembly.

The President was not in it at all, the sources said.

When the Governor and Chief Minister met him earlier Monday and discussed with him options available to them in case the court ordered a restoration, the President advised that all concerned should respect the court's judgement the sources said.

tors in Middle East peace talks here today that it was urgent for them to make progress and warned that Washington could not make progress for them. Edward Djerejian, Assistant Secretary of State for Near Eastern Affairs, said the United States remains fully involved in the tenth round of bilateral talks. The current round of negotiations, which end Thursday, have not so far rendered any results. 22 troops killed as Naga rebels ambush convoy

IMPHAL, June 29. Altogether 29 persons, including 22 army jawans were killed and several others injured when suspected National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN) militants ambushed an army convoy at Khudei Lamkhai area on the Imphal-Moreh road in Manipur's Chandel district this morning, official sources said, reports PTI.

Among the dead were three underground members and three civilians.

The sources said, more un derground members were believed to have been killed during the hour-long encounter.
