PARIS, June 30: Organised crime is increasingly using non-bank financial institutions and other businesses to launder an estimated 85 billion dollar a year generated by worldwide drug trafficking and other criminal activities, a group fighting money laundering said

Tuesday, reports AFP. The Financial Action Task Force (FATF), set up at the request of the 1989 Paris summit of

the Group of Seven (G7) economic super-pow-

ers to track illicit cross-border financial transactions, said investigations over the past year into new money laundering techniques had turned up fresh evidence of this.

The task force, grouping countries and regions which are home to most major financial centres, has pressed on with efforts to persuade additional countries and regions to joint the fight against money laundering, the FATF said in its annual report here.
