Most Japanese oppose further aid to Russia

TOKYO, July, 4: Nearly two thirds of Japanese would oppose giving additional economic aid to Russia, according to a survey published on Wednesday, reports Reuter.

economy is expected to be a major issue at next week's Tokyo summit of the Group of Seven (G7) main industrialised nations.

The survey, conducted by the daily Yomiuri Shimbun, showed about 64 per cent of respondents were against extending aid to Russia in addition to the 43 billion dollar package agreed by G7 finance and foreign ministers in Tokyo in April. At the April meeting, Japan also announced it was offering Russia 1.82 billion in bilateral aid, apparently signalling a departure from its

policy of limiting help to Russia to emergency and humanitarian assistance due to a territorial row.

The main reason cited by poll respondents for withhold-Help for Russia's ailing ing further aid were a belief that the money would not be spent effectively and lack of progress on the decades-old land dispute.

Tokyo demands that Moscow return four islands off northern Japan seized by Soviet troops in 1945.

About a quarter of respondents said they supported giving extra aid, saying the money was needed to help stabilise Russia's economy and society in its transition to a marketbased system.

Four in 10 respondents said they took an interest in the upcoming summit, to be held

on July 7-9, and about six in 10 said that G-7 summits contributed to the resolution of economic, political and other issues. Asked what should top next week's summit agenda most respondents cited ecor nomic issues, environmental protection and the prevention of nuclear proliferation.

The survey canvassed the views of 2,151 people on June 19-20.

The G7 groups - Japan, the United States, Germany, France, Britain, Italy and Canada.

Russian President Boris Yeltsin is also due to attend next week's gathering. Yeltsin cancelled a scheduled trip to Tokyo last year and shelved plans to visit in May due to Japan's alleged intransigence over the islands.

China's shareholding frenzy spreads to Tibet

BEIJING, July 4: China's shareholding frenzy has spread to one of its most remost corners, Tibet, where a mineral water exporter is going public. the official Xinhua news agency reported today, reports Reuter.

Tibet Shengdi Natural Mineral Water Company said it would offer 5,000 public shares to help finance plans to export one of the Himalayan region's most abundant resources - clean water.

There were no details on there percentage of the company to be sold or how much cash would be raised for the scheme to ship bottled mineral water to Hong Kong, the United states and southeast

It was also unclear whether Shengdi would seek a listing on China's fledging stock exchanges in Shanghai and

Shenzhen. Central government officials have announced plans to give the exchanges a national character by fostering listings by at least two state enterprises from each province. Shareholding schemes have captured China's imagination after decades of state ownership of all industry, enabling firms to raise funds

for local operations. Tibet's economy has surged in recent years as Chinese entrepreneurs have sought fortunes from its rich natural resources and tourism.

Tibet Shengdi is a joint venture of the Tibet sports and tourism corporation and the Sichuan economic cooperation company from the neighbouring province.

It said it expected sales this year to reach 66.7 million yuan (dollar 11.7 million).
