Workshop on 'Environment and Development' Increased awareness on environment suggested

Speakers at a workshop on called for creating greater awareness on environmental issues with special emphasis to Bangladesh's water resources, its flora and fauna.

Academics, scientists, representatives of various NGOs, the forestry department officials and members of the media took part in the day-long IUCN workshop on Environment and Development sponsored by Poush Bangladesh held Sunday.

The IUCN, previously known as the International Union for Conservation of Nature and Nature Resources is an environmental organisation that tries to bring together governments, different agencies and NGOs in a world partnership for environment and development.
The focal theme of the workshop was the possible programme of IUCN in Bangladesh in the triennium 1994-96.

The seminar was arranged in an open discussion format where participants were encouraged to submit recommendations.

Running a little late, the inaugural session, chaired by A M Chowdhury, country representative IUCN, began with introductory speeches by six Bangladeshi members of the Species Survival Commission of the IUCN.

They included Harun-er-Rashid, president of Bangladesh POUH, Dr Monowar Hossain, chairman, Multi-disciplinary Action Research Centre, K Z Hossain, Wildlife Society of Bangladesh, G M E Karim, IUCN member and Abdul Wahab Akhand, senior scientific officer, Department of Forestry.
Dr Hossain in his introductory speech said that the main weakness in the environmental field in Bangladesh was lack of knowledge.

He emphasized the need for generating of knowledge especially at the formal level — beginning that is from the primary school to university levels.

"Environmental awareness should start from childhood and so should be incorporated in the school curriculum and teaching methods", he suggested.

Chief guest, Dr Risalat Ahmed of the Department of

Environment in his inaugural speech pointed out that since the Industrial Revolution, mankind has been involved in the reckless plunder of natural resources threatening all kinds of life.

Living in harmony with nature, he said, meant utilizing natural resources in sustainable ways.

One of the topics that sparked off a lively discussion among the participants was water resource management. Dr Monowar Hossain pointed out that water was the most vital resource of Bangladesh.

He added that research on ground water level was far from adequate and badly needed.

Dr Hossain also recommended a study by IUCN on the changing flow of rivers in Bangladesh that have far reaching consequences on the ecosystems.

On the question of flooding, Hossain said that there should be moves to use the benefits of water and get rid of non-benefits of flooding for example the adverse effects on agriculture and prawn culture.

In this context, Professor Abu Toyeb Abu Ahmed of the Zoology Department in Dhaka University, said that aquatic resources were very important for Bangladesh.

He pointed out that over the years there has been a steady decline in aquatic populations especially fish and many species were becoming extinct.
He proposed a programme to

understand the bio-diversity of flora and fauna of Bangladesh. He also pointed out the evils of fertilizers and pesticides that enhance agriculture but have devastating effects on fisheries causing diseases such as ESU (Epizootic Ulcerative Syndrome).
Ahmed recommended a study on the changes in flora and fauna of mangrove forests especially in the coastal areas.

Sattar of the Department of Forestry said that the water supply in Dhaka had significantly decreased by rising of river beds. In the rural areas, deep tubewells were causing scarcity of water leading people to drink polluted water and so be exposed to diseases, he said.

A major portion of the workshop was devoted to the protection and conservation of the largest mangrove forest in the world, Sundarbans.

Hasna Moudud, chairman of CARDMA (Coastal Area Resource Development and Management Association) pointed out that the Sundarbans thrive on fresh water supply. Any project to save the Sundarbans, therefore, depends on proper water resource management, she said.

Moudud proposed that Sundarbans be declared as a world heritage site and stressed the need to protect the Royal Bengal Tiger and other wildlife.

Tahmina Ahmed representing Asia Pacific Forum for environmental journalists recommended a regional study of mangrove forests as part of a system.

Two killed in road mishap

Two persons were killed in separate road accidents outside the city Sunday.

A pedestrian was killed when a speeding bus knocked him at Kandaia, Northdindi at about 4 am yesterday.

The victim identified as Mojib, 8, son of Mohammed Sona Miah was seriously injured and rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where he succumbed to his injuries.

In another road accident, a driver was killed at Abdullahpur at about 11 am yesterday.

The victim identified as Mohammed Monir Hossain Vutto, 45, was seriously injured and immediately sent to the DMCH where the doctors on duty declared him dead.
