Hawkers' market leaders call on Biswas

A delegation of Jatiya Khudra Babshai Hawkers Market Federation called on President Abdur Rahman Biswas at Bangabhaban yesterday, reports BSS.

The 40-member team led by Delwar Hossain, president of the federation, apprised President Biswas of their various problems in carrying out their business including lack of permanent allotment of shops in different municipal markets and other facilities.

They submitted a memorandum and sought President's help for rehabilitation of the small traders, so that they can largely carry out their business. Their other demands included setting up of markets at Glopbagh, Hazaribagh, Rayerbazar, Kallayanpur and Khilgaon at the initiative of the Dhaka Municipal Corporation. Exchanging views with them, President Biswas observed that there were piled up problems for years in different sectors and the present government had been trying to solve them phase by phase.

Draft of new companies law prepared

Cabinet Sub-Committee on Amendment of Existing Companies Act has prepared the draft of a new companies law to meet the present day demand, reports UNB.

A meeting of the sub-committee was held here yesterday that the new companies law was drafted after prolonged discussion with different trade bodies, law agencies and other related organisations.

The draft will be further discussed in different levels and finally it will be placed in the coming session of the Jatiya Sangsad for final adoption.

Convener of the sub-committee Commerce Minister MK Anwar chaired the meeting at Bangladesh Secretariat.

Explaining the background of the development of the Companies Act, the Commerce Minister told the meeting that the necessity of further amending the Companies Act of 1913 was felt with the changing demand of the society. Though the original Companies Act of 1913 was partially amended in different phases, it is still inadequate to meet the present day demand, he said.

The democratic government wants to enact a new companies law which might help implement the liberal trade and industrial policy of the government for quick industrialisation of the country, the minister said.

The meeting discussed in de-

tails the draft law which was earlier prepared by a working group of the sub-committee led by State Minister for Law and Justice Barrister Aminul Haque. Different provisions of the law relating to the protection of the minority share-holders' interest, fixation of dates for annual general meeting and special meeting of the Companies, problems relating to the transfer of the companies from the public sector to private sector and the role of the judiciary in conducting the activities of the companies were discussed with greater emphasis.

The meeting was attended by LORD and Cooperatives Minister Barrister Abdus Salam Talukder, Industries Minister Shamsul Islam Khan, Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar, Information Minister Nazmul Huda, Barriers Minister Barrister Rafiqul Islam Mia, Planning Minister Zahuruddin Khan, State Minister for Law, Justice and Establishment Barrister Aminul Haque, Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister KM Rabbani, Industries Secretary Hasnat Abdul Haye, Attorney General Aminul Haque, President of Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industries Mahabubur Rahman and senior officials of the concerned industries and organisations.

Amendment of irrigation tax law discussed

Two persons were killed and another was injured in two separate road mishaps in and around the city yesterday.

Sheikh Farid, 30, was seriously injured and later died at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital while a truck in which he was travelling, turned turtle near Gazipur at about 2.30 Tuesday night.

Farid was coming to Dhaka from Sherpur.

One Md Ali, 30, who also was travelling by the same truck was seriously injured. He was admitted to the DMCH in critical condition.

Besides, an unidentified male aged about 31 died on the spot while a minibus ran over him in front of the Gulistan Cinema Hall at about 8 in the morning yesterday.



Prof Jabbar dead

The founder Registrar of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) Prof. MA Jabbar died at PG Hospital here yesterday morning. He was 78, reports UNB.

Prof Jabbar left behind five sons, two daughters and a host of relatives, friends, and well-wishers to mourn his death. He was buried at Bannani graveyard after his Namaj-e-Janaza was held on the BUET campus in the afternoon.

Vice Chancellor Prof. Mohammad Shahjahan, teachers, officials and employees of the university attended the janaza.

Born in 1915 Prof Jabbar received a number of national awards, including Ekushey Padak (1985), Akademy Shahtya Purashkar (1983) and Dr. Qudrat-e-Khuda Smritipadak (1980), for his outstanding contribution in the field of science and literature.

Death condoled

Prof M Shahjahan, Vice-Chancellor of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) yesterday expressed his deep shock at the death of Prof Mohammad Abdul Jabbar.
