I am so glad that our inter national athletes have heeded my recent warning that no one will be considered for selection for the World Championships unless he or she takes part in the trails," Okeyo said.

He said the first three runners to finish would be auto matically selected if they had attained qualifying standards The deadline for qualifying times is August 4.

So far 91 athletes have qual ified, but Kenya's quota for the World Championships is 28 runners, Okeyo added.

He denied reports that Yobes Ondieki, who set a new world record in the 10,000 metres ten days ago, would be entered for the 5,000 meres to defend the title he won in Tokyo two years

# Gunnell angered by pay disparity

LONDON, July 20: Sally Gunnell, Olympic champion in the 400-metre hurdles, is angry at the disparity in pay between men and women athletes, reports AP.


Gunnell reacted to a report by a women's track and field committee that says she receives dirs 15,000 per meeting in Britain while men's Olympic 100-metre champion Linford Christie gets dirs 45,000.

"If the figures are correct then the situation is quite wrong and unfair when the both of us are current Olympic champions", Gunnell told the Evening Standard newspaper in Nice, France, where she is due to compete Wednesday.

"As I understand it the margin between men and women tennis players at Wimbledon has been narrowed down to about 10 percent". Gunnell said. "Yet in athletics the two top champions of our country seem to have a gender difference of 33 percent."


