Ship movement in Ctg port suspended

CHITTAGONG, July 23: Movement of all kinds of ships on Chittagong port channel remained totally suspended in the face of heavy current caused by the continuous discharge of lake water from Kaptai Dam, officials said.

Heavy onrush of water in the Kaptai lake from the upper catchments after torrential rain in the hilly areas forced the Kaptai Hydro-electric Project authority to discharge the waters that had already crossed the danger level overflowing the dam, officials informed.

The rate of water discharge from the lake recorded today is three lakh cubic feet per second. "The Kaptas lake waters flooring down lan demandals right with the highest swelling has threatened the ship movement on Chittagong port channel," said the Chairman of Chitta gong port Amanul Islam Chowdhury while talking to The
