## Bangladesh's work force will be 20m by 2000

At least a billion jobs must be created worldwide in the next 10 years to prevent the gap between the poor and rich from widening. Demographic experts have agreed in a series of published reports, BSS.

By 2025, the earth's population will have grown to 8.5 billion, against 5.5 billion today, and those of working age will have gone up to 3.7 billion from 2.4 billion.

Before the year 2000, Mexico's work force will have reached 18 million people. Bangladesh 20 million and Kenya 7.3 million.

Developing countries, where most of the population growth is taking place, will need to create 38 million jobs a year, only to keep abreast of people joining the job market, not taking into account the existing
