After the sun set the young girls gather in the bus stations and cinema hall areas alluring the people.

These shelterless girls after sundown usually throng at the different bus stations and in the verandas of schools and colleges, stadium area and corridors of the government offices to pass their nights.

Town dwellers alleged that the beggars who live in an subhuman condition are spreading various infectious diseases in the town.

The people of the district town and thana headquarters have urged the government to rehabilitate the beggars to mitigate their sufferings.

5,80,500 bales of jute likely to be produced

BARISAL, July 30: About 5,80,500 bales of jute will be produced in eleven southern districts under Barisal Agriculture Extension Zone in the current season, reports

According to an official source, a total of 59,850 hectares of land was brought under jute cultivation in these districts this year.
