

ZURICH, Aug 3: Olympic champion Linford Christie must beat wor-

Carl Lewis in the 100 metres at Zurich to stay in the running for a jackpot in gold worth up to dirs 260,000, reports AP.

Zurich meet organiser Res Bruegger and sponsors of three other Grand Prix meets is Oslo, Berlin and Brussels have offered 20 kilograms (44 pounds) of gold to be split among any athletes winning their event at all four meets.

Christie is on track after winning the 100 metres at Oslo on July, 10.

Bruegger has lined up a field of athletes with 24 Olympics gold medals and 17 world records between them for Wednesday's Weltklasse meet in Zurich. It is reportedly the richest track meet of all times with a total purse of 5.3 million Swiss francs (dlrs 3.5 million).

It will also be an important test before the World Championships in track and field starting Aug. 14 in Stuttgart, Germany. The World Championships will be followed

Lewis, an eight-time Olympic gold medalist who has a fiercely loyal following among the Zurich fans, set the world mark of 9.86 at the 1991 World Championship in Tokyo.

Any athlete setting a world record Wednesday at Letzigrund Stadium will receive one kilogram (2.2 pounds) of gold, which is worth about dlrs 13,000. Lewis and Christie each received dlrs 150,000 for last week's clash. Terms of their Zurich deal were not disclosed

Butch Reynolds will be returning to the track where he smashed the 400-meter world record in 1988 for the first time since a nearly 2 1/2-year suspension for drug use.

Reynolds, whose world mark of 43.29 still stands, will face younger US rivals Michael Johnson, who has run the year's fastest 400, and Guincy Watts, the second-fastest of all time after winning the gold medal at last year's Olympics.

Algeria's Noureddive Morceli, who has been training in the

Swiss Alps, promised to attack his world record in the 1,500 meters at Zurich. He blamed a slow pacemaker for a fatled attempt at improving his 3 minute, 28.82 second mark last month in Stockholm. World champion Yobes On-

dieki leads a big Kenyan field in the 5,000 meters, where his arch-rival is 10,000-meter Olympic champion Khalid Skah of Morocco. Ondieki became the first to run the 10,000 in less than 27 minutes last month.

Janusz Sidlo passes away

WARSAW, Aug 3 : Poland's former world javelin record holder Janusz Sidlo died in Warsaw on Monday at the age of 60, the Polish news agency PAP said, reports Reuter.

He said a world record of 83.66 metres in Milan in 1956 and won a silver medal at the Melbourne Olympics the same

Sidlo, who had a heart condition, won the European Championships in 1954 and 1958 and was Polish champion four times.


