

Tagore's works message of global fraternity : Tariq

anniversary of the poet at the Shishu Academy. A large number of children with their parents attended the function.

Presided over by Chairman of the Academy Dr. Kazi Anwara Mansoor, the discussion meeting was also addressed by educationist and literature Dr. Begum Jahanara and Golam Kibria, director of the academy.

Tariq said Bengali speaking people are indebted to Rabindranath because he made them known to the world through his work. By observing his birth and death anniversary they attempt to pay back their national gratitude to his greatness, he added.

The minister said the government after coming to power took the initiatives to celebrate Tagore's birth and observing his 52th anniversaries at national level.

He appealed to the guardians to teach their wards with the qualities of Rabindranath so that they could contribute their might in building a better Bangladesh.

Symposium on Hiroshima Day 'Use atomic science for human welfare'

The United Nations Association of Bangladesh (UNAB) organised a symposium at its office yesterday on the occasion of Hiroshima Day, reports UNB.

Noted scientist Dr. Abdullah Al-Muti Sharfuddin was the main speaker at the symposium chaired by Prof. Salahuddin Ahmed, a senior educationist.

It was addressed by noted economist and Chairman of Bangladesh Unnayan Parishad Dr. Quazi Kholiquzaman Ahmed, zoologist Prof. Abu Bakar, journalist Santosh Gupta, and UNAB Secretary General Syed Ahmad Hossain.

Dr. Sharfuddin, in his keynote speech, recalled the tragic events of exploding atomic bomb in the historic city of Hiroshima in 1945 where millions of people were killed and injured, besides being badly affected by nuclear poisons.

He strongly criticised the war mongers all over the world and called upon the international community to mobilise public

opinion through United Nations against war.

Dr. Abdullah Al-Muti Sharfuddin also called upon scientists across the world not to engage themselves in preparing war materials but to work for the use of atomic science for the welfare of mankind.

He particularly mentioned the dangers of using nuclear weapons and making nuclear tests which greatly affected environment causing serious threat to the lives of millions of people throughout the world.

Dr. Quazi Kholiquzaman Ahmed denounced war and war preparations all over the world and called for total disarmament in the greater interest of development in the process of creating a new world free from hunger, poverty, disease and illiteracy.

He was also critical about the present role of the United Nations and pleaded for meaningful and more effective role of UN in peacekeeping.

Two killed in separate incidents

Two persons were killed in separate incidents in and on the outskirts of the city yesterday.

A garment worker was killed when a bus helper pushed him down from a running vehicle at Rupshat, Demra in the city at about 4 pm yesterday.

The victim identified as Mohammed Hannan Miah, 22 was seriously injured and rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where the attending doctors declared him dead.

Mohammed Hannan was a resident of Gathama, under Bagijanj thana at Jamalpur district.

In another incident, Mohammed Dulal Miah, 30 was killed by his younger brothers Manik and Seraj at Vikabtek, Kapasia, Gaziipur Thursday.

Relatives of the victim said Dulal Miah quarrelled with his younger brother Manik Miah over land property at about 8:30am Thursday.

At one stage of the quarrel Manik with his brother Seraj attacked Dulal and stabbed in his head severely.

Dulal was admitted to the DMCH where he died immediately.

Both the bodies were sent to the DMCH morgue for autopsy.
