## Two bodies recovered in city

## Two die in separate incidents

Two persons died and another one was injured in separate incidents in the city in the last 48 hours ending Sunday.

Mohammad Abdur Razzak, 25, drowned when he went to take a bath at the river Turag in the city Saturday noon.

In another incident Ruku Mia, 40, fell from the roof of a house at Rampura in the city Sunday.

He succumbed to his injuries on his arrival at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Meanwhile, at Kawranbazar a young man received bullet injuries when he was attacked by a group of miscreants.

The victim Sabir Hossain, 30, alleged that he was waylaid by a group of hoodlums numbering four to five when he was crossing the road near Sonargaon Hotel.

The cause of the attack was not available.

The bodies were sent to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.

## Relief worth Tk 24.5 cr allocated for flood-victims

The government so far allocated Tk 24.50 crore as cash and relief materials for the flood victims of the country, official sources said, reports BSS.

The relief materials include Taka one crore 59 thousand 75 thousand in cash, Taka one crore 25 lakh as house building grant, Taka seven lakh 75 thousand as miscellaneous grant, 9,960 metric tons of rice, 180 metric tons of wheat (relief), 13,650 pieces of lungis and 13,650 pieces of sarees, 5,500

tins of biscuits, 4,250 bundles of CI sheet and other goods.

A Flood Forecasting and Warning Division press release said here yesterday that the Brahmaputra and the Ganges continued to rise at all points. The rivers in the Meghna and the south eastern hill basins registered rise and fall. The Surma at Kanaighat and Sunamganj, the Kushiya at Amalshid and Sheola and the Meghna at Bhalrab Bazar are flowing above the danger mark.

## Killing of Thana Livestock Officer condemned

The Bangladesh Veterinary Association yesterday strongly condemned the killing of Himechhar Thana Livestock Officer Dr Mohammad Aftabuddin by a gang of miscreants, reports BSS.

Aftab was killed by the miscreants on August 2 last in Himechhar of Chandpur district.
