The parishad convenor Abul Bashar in a statement further accused the authorities of creating fresh dissatisfaction among the workers by not releasing the detailed workers, withdrawing cases against and writing off punishment against them, resuming production in the closed mills and paying them financial benefits, as promised by the relevant ministers.

Under such circumstances, Bashar said, the workers of 15 industrial units in Khulna had called for a day-long shutdown and mass hunger strike on August 20.

He supported the programme and called on the government to immediately implement its latest accord with the labour leaders, who postponed a 48hour nationwide labour shutdown scheduled for August 19-20 after the government agreed on their demands.
