LONDON, Aug 13: Mike Smith, the bookmakers' favou rite to succeed Ted Dexter as chairman of the England selectors, will manage the tour party to the West Indies next year, reports Reuter.

When the news was released by the Test and county Cricket Board on Thursday, Smith was quick to stress that the approach was made before Dexter's resignation was announced three days earlier after England had suffered their 10th defeat in their last 11 Tests.

According to TCCB chief executive Alan Smith, the initial approach to his namesake known as M J K — was made before certain events unfolded in recent days.

The 60-year-old Warwick shire chairman took "two or three weeks" before accepting the invitation. Smith, who played 50 Tests for England, 25 as captain, said he was "looking forward very much indeed to the trip."
