# A New Approach to Art

Art galleries are springing up all over the city showing a growing need for Dhakaites to forget themselves in a world that only artists can create. Gallery Tone is the latest addition to the numerous art galleries in Dhaka.

Opened only this June, this gallery has a distinctive character. First of all it is owned by a woman - Kanakchampa, a young Chakma artist with a vivacious, easy going manner.

Why another art gallery? "I felt an urge to do this," says Kanakchampa, "to introduce our own artists to our people as well as to the world art market." She came up with this idea when she went to Florida (U.S.A.) to receive the second prize in abstract painting arranged by Miniature Art Exhibitton.

Kanakchampa explained that during her visit she met with 75 artists from various countries and later went to visit famous art galleries within the US, Netherlands and London.

Gallery Tone has two Divisions of Fine Arts the tone photography section and tone painting and art section. Kanakchampa deals mainly with the tone painting section while her husband Khalid Mahmood along with another artist Golam Mostafa manage the photography section. Gallery Tone is unique in that it is the only

gallery that includes a photography section. There is no doubt that art photography has been neglected through out this country. This section has been set up to improve the quality of professional photography. "The world photography market is much more demanding than ours, says Mahmood. He adds that because there is no particular buyers' circle the quality of professional photography is still quite poor. We are willing to take steps' says Mahmood, "to improve our model and professional photography. If we can do it we will be able to compete with world

famous photography Tone photography section makes documentary films on promising and well known artists of our country. In the past, big companies such as multinationals, have depended on foreign photograph publishers to produce their photo papers, research oriented publications and quality print works. Tone photography section has made a breakthrough in this field by publishing these

type of quality photograph publications. Among other things Gallery Tone has already published a book on our traditional and cultural arts and crafts and four post cards on paintings.

In the future, the tone photography section is going to arrange workshops on fashion modeling, make up, professional colour photography, lighting and printing. They have already made contact with well known artists in foreign countries to conduct all these workshops.

Usually these type of competitions are organised only at the government level by the public art galleries and institutions. Kanakchampa mentions that gallery Tone will also arrange the exchange of different art works of Bangladeshi artists with those of foreign artists. The exhibition of our artists will be held there and the art of foreign artists will be exhibited in Gallery Tone," says Kanakchampa.

With its innovative approach, Gallery Tone is the latest art venture in the private sector that offers great opportunities to young aspiring artists to get exposure in the international art market



Till June 1993, a total of Tk

1,829 crore had been invested in REB while, he added, the government had allocated Tk 100 crore from its Annual Development Plan (ADP) for REB's development. Energy Secretary Razzak in

his speech indicated that the Asian Development Bank (ADB) might sign a major agreement with Bangladesh on rural electrification late this year. REB Chairman Enamul in-

formed that since 1978 the REB had set up about 50,000 km of electric lines and it had about eight lakh customers.
